GOVERNMENT MEETINGS

During the month of May the City Council will actually meet three times rather than just two. They will meet as they normally meet on the first Wednesday, May 3rd and the third Wednesday, May 17th. The normal meeting for the first week in June has been moved up a week into May so the council will also meet on the 5th Wednesday - May 31st. Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During all three May meetings the council will continue the process to develop the FY2018 municipal budget with presentations on budget proposals from department heads and various city agencies. During the May 3rd meeting they will be reviewing the Fire Departments' budget and the budget for the Redevelopment Agency. During the May 17th meeting they will discuss the Library and Police Agency budgets. Public hearings on the budget will be held during the meeting on the 31st.

During the May meetings the Council also plans to continue work on variety of open issues including possible changes to the City Center zoning regulations, other inter-local and development agreements, plus miscellaneous ordinance changes.

UTILITES

Please make sure your water meter lid is uncovered and free from any of the following, railroad ties, flower boxes, sprinkler boxes, dirt, grass or any obstacle. Trim back bushes and plants around the meter. Our meter readers are trying to get an accurate reading, and they are also looking for any problems in the meter barrel. This saves you money as well.

Just a reminder, please **don't open the water meter lids** to check your reading or turn off your water. There are radios and wires that can easily be broken. If you need your water service turned off, please contact us at 782-1310 ext. 11 or 10.

Every year we have commercial trucks pull up to our Hydrants and steal water. Some even break the hydrant, making it unavailable to the houses in your neighborhood in an emergency. It is with the help of our citizens that we can get a handle on this. The city does issue special permits to companies that are authorized to use some hydrants. If you see someone using the water at a hydrant in North Logan, please call Peggy at 752-1310 ext 11, to verify if they have a permit or catch those who do not.

On-site Use of Storm Water

On-site retention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention, or detention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property. Controlling and reducing the amount of runoff from a site can reduce the risk of flooding as well as reduce the size and extent of drainage infrastructure.

PUBLIC SAFETY

In 1962, Pres. Kennedy proclaimed May15 as National Peace Officers Memorial Day and the calendar week of May15 falls, as National Police Week. National Police Week pays special recognition to law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others.

At the State Capital in SLC, you will find the Utah Law Enforcement Memorial. On May 4, 2017, West Valley Officer Cody Brotherson and UHP Trooper Eric Ellsworth, the named will be added to the memorial wall as the 140 and 141 Utah Officers to be killed in the line of duty.

There are five Officers on that wall from our valley:

*1929 Officer Willard Dahle - Logan City Police Department

*1959 Deputy Alma Sorenson -Cache County Sheriff's Office

*1959 Officer Edwin Edwards - Logan City Police Department

*1974 Lt. James Merrill - Cache County Sheriff's Office

*1984 Deputy Charles Dickey Jr - Cache County Sheriff's Office

May 14-20 you will notice 141 U.S. Flags lining the entryway to the North Park Police Department, 575 E 2500 N. Each Flag is a memorial to the officers of this state who have given their all. I would encourage you to visit the memorial on Capitol Hill the next time you are visiting SLC. The Members of the North Park Police Department are proud to serve you and dedicate ourselves to our motto of Respect, Integrity, Courage and Honor.

SECONDARY WATER USERS

Its spring time again in our great city. Irrigation systems installed using culinary water need a backflow assembly. For those of you that have a secondary water source and use it in conjunction with culinary water for irrigation there is a need for a backflow device also. These devices are used to keep canal water from contaminating the city culinary water. The device is not a fool proof unit and may fail. This is why it needs to be tested yearly by a certified backflow technician. For a tester go to Utah.gov then type in backflow tester in space provided this brings up a list to choose from. Make this a part of your spring to-do list test backflow device. Please do your part and keep our water safe.
