What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meets on the first and third Wednesdays of each month. October's meetings will therefore be on October 5th and 19th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the two meetings in October the Council will continue to consider a variety of issues that they have been working on including the annexation of some unincorporated land between 1050 to 1200 East and 2850 to 2950 North, the approval of an addendum to Wildercrest Subdivision Development Agreement, and the approval of a new/replacement Development Agreement for the Canyon Gates Subdivision. The Council may also be considering the approval of a development agreement for the Ashley Court Subdivision - a subdivision of 5.18 acres into twelve lots on the east side of a new 600 East and between about 2600 and 2700 North and the concept plan for the subdivision of approximately eight acres east of 400 East between 1900 and 2000 North.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

Water Pollution and Leaves

Fall is in the air and that means it's time to clean up those leaves in your yard. As you do, please remember to not put grass clippings, leaves, and yard debris in the street, storm drain, or ditch. Littering with your yard debris can cause problems for you and your water. Storm drains can clog, streets can flood, and water can become polluted. To avoid this, try using clippings and leaves as fertilizer or use a mulching lawn mower. Maybe try composting leaves and clippings, or call 435-716-9755 to sign up for a green waste container for \$4.00 per month (weekly pick up April - November). Please be considerate while cleaning up your yards this fall season.
