Cache County is VOTE BY MAIL

Please be aware that on Election Day there will be **NO POLLING PLACE** in your precinct. Cache County is VOTE BY MAIL this General Election, and all active registered voters should have received their ballots approximately four weeks prior to the election. You have three options for voting in this election [For questions, contact the Cache County Clerk's Office (435) 755-1460]:

1. You may vote on the ballot mailed to you and return it by mail in the envelope provided. Ballots must be **postmarked by the day before** the election, OR
2. You may deposit your ballot at an official ballot drop-off location during their regular office hours (Note: North Logan City Offices is one drop-off location and is open from 8:00am - 5:00pm Monday through Friday). You can find additional ballot drop-off locations at **www.cachecounty.org/elections**, OR
3. You may drop off your ballot in person at the County Clerk's Office at 179 North Main in Logan through Election Day. On Election Day the Clerk's Office will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

ON ELECTION DAY (Tuesday, November 8th)...

Cache County is participating in the same day voter registration pilot program, where you can register to vote and cast your ballot the same day. Dir of Elections, Mark Thomas (Lt. Governor's Staff) explains how it works for unregistered voters: "They would be required to show proof of identity and also proof of residency. Then they will be given a provisional ballot and then later, in the days to come after the election the clerk will process those. They'll ensure they are who they say they are, that they live where they say they live, they'll ensure they didn't vote in any other location and if all of that checks out then they will go ahead and count their ballot." Three Voting Assistance Centers are available and open from 7am - 8pm on Election Day:

- Smithfield Civic Center: 45 E 100 N, Smithfield
- Nibley City Office: 455 W 3200 S, Nibley
- Cache County Clerk's Office: 179 N Main Ste. 102, Logan.

What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council will meet only once during the month of November. That meeting will be held November 9th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the two meetings in November the Council will continue to work on approval of several subdivisions which they have been working on for several months including, the approval of an addendum to Wildercrest Subdivision Development Agreement, and the approval of a new/replacement Development Agreement for the Canyon Gates Subdivision. The Council will also continue to work on the final approval of the Ashley Court Subdivision - on 600 E. and between about 2600 & 2700 N. They will also look at the development plan for a retirement community subdivision of duplexes, 8 acres east of 400 E between 1900 & 2000 N. They will also be working on approving another residential subdivision, Wheatland Hills, on the east bench. This subdivision is about 155 acres and 118 lots in one-acre zoning and located at approximately 2200 E and between 3100 & 3400 N. The council will also be working on some draft changes to the municipal code dealing with a variety of issues namely e-cigarettes, trails, and the city's subdivision approval process.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.



We are starting a new DAV (Disabled American Veteran's) chapter in Cache Valley. Between January 1, 2014-December 31, 2014, our NSO's & TSO's (all wartime-wounded, injured or ill Veterans) provided representation for over 340,000 claims for Veterans and their families before VA, obtaining for them more than \$3.7 billion in new and retroactive benefits.

The DAV also provides a volunteer transportation network which transport's Veterans to & from VA medical centers managed by 192 service coordinators located at 197 medical centers, with 9,000 volunteers

and in 2014 alone provided 24,356,351 miles, providing 716,302 free rides and donating 1,723,175 hours of their time. Please join our new chapter and help us reach out to those Veterans here in Cache Valley that need help and support. Need not be a volunteer but would be great just to have you involved in the establishment of this chapter. In order to finalize and register this new chapter we need at least 50 disabled Veterans, who will be on the original charter document forever. After the chapter is formed anyone who is already a DAV member from a chapter located outside of Cache Valley may transfer to the new chapter. Thank you.

COMMERCIAL & BUSINESS STORM DRAIN SYSTEM PROTECTION

- Regularly clean/sweep parking lots to prevent debris run-off into storm drain system
- Inspect and clean storm drain inlets and catch basins of any debris or garbage
- Where applicable, install oil/water separators, chemical separators, snouts, or other appropriate filtration devices
- Limit the amount of pesticides and herbicides applied to lawn, park strips, and landscaped areas
- Eliminate excessive use of fertilizers to landscaping. Sweep up excess fertilizer rather than hosing it away
- Verify that wash bay facilities are draining to sanitary sewer and not to storm drains
- Cover loaded trucks to prevent items from blowing out and entering storm drain systems
- Minimize the use of de-icing salts or use alternate methods for snow removal
- Cover trash containers to prevent garbage migration via wind and/or animals to storm water system
- Regularly inspect and maintain vehicles to make sure no fluids are leaking that would pollute storm drain systems

WATER DEPARTMENT

If you have a sprinkler system connected to the City water line, it's that time of the year to drain your system and blow out your lines to protect from freezing. When you turn off your sprinkler system, please make **SURE IT IS TURNED OFF ALL THE WAY**. If left on even a quarter of a turn, water can leak out your stop and waste valve all winter long.

ANNUAL CEMETERY FLOWER & DECORATION REMOVAL

On Nov. 23rd the City will discard all decorations and flowers from the Cemetery that appear out of condition or are not in compliance with the City's Cemetery Ordinance, including shepherds hooks. This cleaning takes place semi-annually after Memorial Day and Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance please go to the City website, www.northlogancity.org.

"Glass containers are prohibited...small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, flowers, decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain within the 6" concrete base (mowing strip) on the north and/or south of the headstone/monument. Shepherds hooks, pin-wheels, etc. are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone, mowing strip. All decorations, vases, toys, et., are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed."

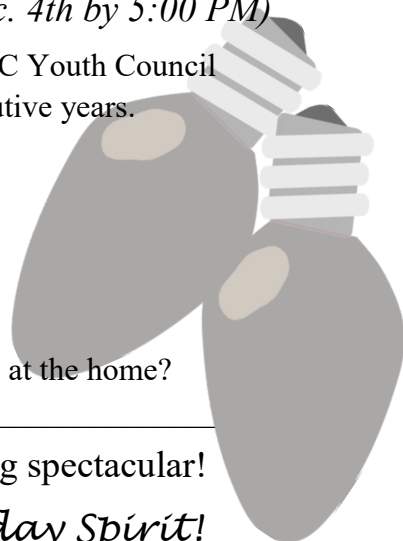

Do not put your garbage/recycling out the night before if it looks like there will be snow during the night. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep your roads clean and safe for you and your family.
