What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meets on the first and third Wednesdays of each month. April's meetings will therefore be on April 6th and 20th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During both meetings in April the council will continue working on the FY2017 budget. They will be getting briefings from various department heads, specifically discussing the storm water and facilities departments' budgets, and the non-departmental budget. Let your input be heard early in the process by letting the city staff or the council know where you would like the city to spend its resources.

The official council agendas as they are posted at the city office and on the State of Utah Public Notice Website at <http://www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html>. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

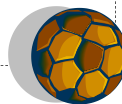
