What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meets on the first and third Wednesdays of each month. June's meetings will therefore be on June 1st and 15th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During both meetings in June the council will continue working on the city's budgets. During the June 1st meeting the council will hold two public hearings (at 6:35 and 6:40 pm) to receive input from the public regarding revisions to the FY2016 municipal budget and the adoption of the new FY2017 budget. Let your input be heard during these public hearing regarding what you would like the city to spend its resources on. During the June 18th meeting the council will consider the resolutions to adopt the FY2017 budget and a final revision to the FY2016 budget.

The council will hold another public hearing on June 1st (at 6:45) to receive input on a proposed rezone of 4.3 acres of land from R-1-12 Residential zoning to MXG Mixed-use General zoning. The property surrounds the existing Pioneer Valley Lodge which is part of the North Logan Retirement Residence Subdivision located at approximately 400 East and 2400 North. Following the public hearing the council may consider an ordinance adopting the revised zoning. The Council will also continue to discuss other possible changes to plans for the area in and around the city center.

During the June 1st meeting the council will consider a resolution to allow the citizens of the city to vote in the upcoming general election in November on establishing the Cache Water District.

The official council agendas are posted at the city office and on the State of Utah Public Notice Website at <http://www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html>. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

Planning Commission – Looking for Community Involvement

The Planning Commission has been working on the revisions to our city's Land Use Section of the General Plan and is interested in getting more citizen involvement/input with this process. In the Land Use Code it points out the importance of future planning throughout the community and to help facilitate this planning, our community has been divided into planning districts (see map). Because each district has different land uses and characteristic, it is important that each district be looked at differently, according to the different land uses currently found in each.

The Planning Commission is interested in putting together District Committees for each district, made up of those who live and work in the different districts. It is very important to have input from those who live in these different districts, which will help with the future planning needed in each district.

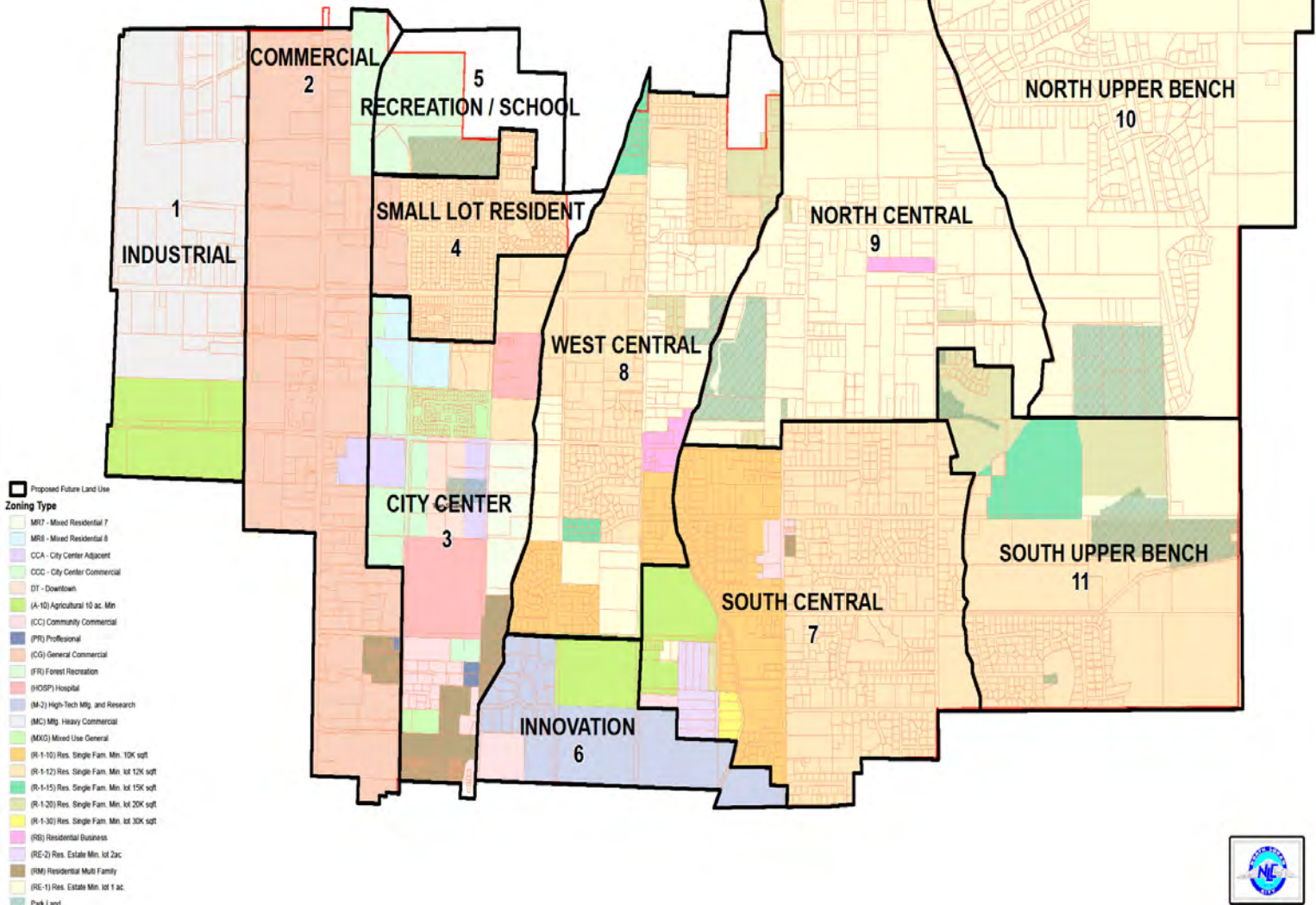

Benefits of On-site Use of Storm Water

On-site retention, or detention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property. Controlling and reducing the amount of runoff from a site can reduce the risk of flooding as well as reduce the size and extent of drainage infrastructure. The use of vegetation in sustainable storm water management practices provides substantial benefits for water quality and quantity. Vegetation intercepts rainfall, reducing the erosivity of raindrops. Vegetation increases surface friction, slowing runoff and promoting settling of suspended solids. Root systems increase pore space and promote infiltration of storm water, and the roots themselves help to anchor soil, protecting against rill and gully formation from concentrated flows. Vegetation can also help to remove pollutants from storm water through biological uptake of nutrients.

Seniors' Luncheon

With the closing of the Golden Corral, we had to make some changes in the North Logan Senior Citizens' monthly luncheon. The luncheons have changed to the Chuck-A-Rama Restaurant in Logan. We will hold our monthly luncheon at **12:00 noon on Monday, June 13th**, at Chuck-A-Rama, 138 South Main in Logan. The cost is now **\$5.00** per person and all North Logan senior citizens are invited to attend. North Logan City Parks and Recreation will continue to subsidize the luncheon as they have in the past, but this subsidy is only for North Logan City residents. You can prove your residency by showing a North Logan Library card, a driver's license with a North Logan address, or a piece of mail such as your utility bill addressed to you in North Logan. Please honor the City's stipulation that the subsidy is only for bona-fide North Logan residents. Non-North Logan Residents can join with us but they will pay the full price at the cashier at the restaurant. 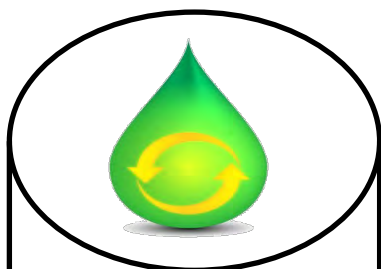

UTILITIES

It is time to check the area around your water meter. **Please make sure your meter lid is uncovered and free from any of the following:** railroad ties, flower boxes, sprinkler boxes, dirt, bushes and grass, or any obstacle. Trim back all bushes and plants around the meter. Our meter readers are trying to get an accurate reading, and they are also looking for any problems in the meter barrel. When they have easy access to the meters, it makes it possible for them to do their job. The majority of North Logan property owners are always so willing to do their part to help us out. Thank you so much for your support!

Just a reminder, please **don't open the water meter lids** to check your reading or turn off your water. There are radios, touch pads and wires that can easily be broken. If you need your water service turned off, please contact us at 435-752-1310 extension 11 or 10, and we will get someone from the city to meet you unless it is an emergency and you are flooding. In that case, go ahead and turn it off to stop any further damage.




With the recent rainfall received in the last few weeks, we are implementing phase 1 - the green level - no water supply problems, from our Water Shortage Management Policies and Procedures Plan. However, we are asking residents to please continue to conserve water so we can make it through the summer. Phase 1 - Green - Normal	Encourage water use conservation	No water supply problems.
Phase 2 - Yellow - Caution	15-20%	Moderate drought. Indications are that this condition will extend for the rest of the water season.
Phase 3 - Orange - High Caution	30-40%	Moderate to severe drought conditions. Water supply is not meeting the demand.
Phase 4 - Red - Warning	50-60%	Extreme, progressive, severe drought. Critical need to reduce water usage and increase water management strategies.
Phase 5 - Purple - Severe	75% and even more if needed	Most severe drought. Supply not able to keep up with the demand and/or there is a possibility of mandatory shut off of water service for part or all of the City. Includes when water is being shut off due to contamination.
