Find Community Spirit in Our Public Parks

I'm writing this newsletter from Eastern Pennsylvania where Ann and I are tending grandchildren for ten days. Spring has sprung here. The tulips are in full bloom. Neighborhoods are awash with white, pink, crimson and yellow blossoms of flowering trees and bushes. The aroma of bright green grass, freshly mowed, pervades the air. Everyone (with the possible exception of allergy sufferers sneezing their way through high pollen counts) is enjoying the 60-70 degree weather with its gentle breezes. Word from back home in North Logan is that Spring has had a couple of false starts with old man winter not quite ready to loosen his frosty grip.

Most notable to me here are the numerous lovely community parks. The one we like the best is only a five minute drive away. The grandchildren love to race around the miniature track on their scooters and tricycle or play in the gigantic sand pile dotted with a climbable rock sculpture and filled with beach toys. The park is rimmed by a magnificent one mile path three lanes wide which meanders through woods and then breaks out into fields of wild flowers and lawn accompanied by a shorter half mile track. One lane is for walkers/joggers, a middle lane for in-line skaters and a wider lane for cyclists. From dawn until dusk, young mothers with babes in strollers, serious runners, those walking alone, hand in hand or small groups all dot the course. Comfortable benches along the way invite one to sit and rest awhile. They are all in their own way fulfillment of the sentiment etched in stone at the park's entrance which says

"People who visit parks renew their spirit of community and take it with them when they go."

It is this spirit that North Logan's Parks and Recreation Department splendidly achieves with our own collection of parks. If any particular class of activity predominates in our parks, it is the excellent system of organized teams and leagues for our youth. In addition, I personally would like to see more people use the parks in the informal ways such as I describe above. Parks are great for going out to the ballgame and cheering with the crowd. They can also be a wonderful escape from life's hustle and bustle, a place of relaxation and quiet refuge. As a City, we are excited about the new recreational opportunities on the drawing boards that will materialize with the completion of the joint ventures between the community and the new high school as well as improvements and additions to our existing parks. We hope you feel that the City's investment in our parks and recreation programs are wise ones.

Thank you to those who use the parks whether as a participant or spectator in team sports, going on a family picnic, or just visiting on your own to fly a kite or whatever. If you haven't been to the park recently, please take the opportunity to do so this summer. In any event, we welcome your comments on how we can improve our parks even further. They are indeed a prime community gathering place which can bring us all closer together in common purpose.

In 1962, President Kennedy proclaimed May 15 as National Peace Officers Memorial Day and the calendar week in which May 15 falls, as National Police Week. Established by a joint resolution of Congress in 1962, National Police Week pays special recognition to those law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others.

At the State Capital in Salt Lake City on the west side of the grounds you will find the Utah Law Enforcement Memorial. On May 5th 2016, Unified Police Officer Doug Barney's name will be added to the memorial wall as the 138th Utah Officer to be killed in the line of duty.

There are five Officers on that wall from our valley:
1929 Officer Willard R. Dahle of the Logan City Police Department
1959 Deputy Alma P. Sorenson of the Cache County Sheriff's Office
1959 Officer Edwin L. Edwards of the Logan City Police Department
1974 Lt. James R. Merrill of the Cache County Sheriff's Office
1984 Deputy Charles H. Dickey Jr. of the Cache County Sheriff's Office



During the week of May 15th Through May 21st you will notice 138 U.S. Flags lining the entryway to the North Park Police Department, 575 E 2500 N in North Logan. Each Flag is a memorial to the officers of this state who have given their all for us. I would encourage you to visit the memorial on Capitol Hill the next time you are visiting Salt Lake City with your family. The Members of the North Park Police Department are proud to serve you and dedicate ourselves to our motto of Respect, Integrity, Courage and Honor.

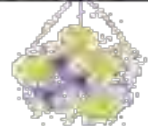

Benefits of On-site Use of Storm Water

On-site retention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention, or detention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property. Controlling and reducing the amount of runoff from a site can reduce the risk of flooding as well as reduce the size and extent of drainage infrastructure. The use of vegetation in sustainable storm water management practices provides substantial benefits for water quality and quantity. Vegetation intercepts rainfall, reducing the erosivity of raindrops. Vegetation increases surface friction, slowing runoff and promoting settling of suspended solids. Root systems increase pore space and promote infiltration of storm water, and the roots themselves help to anchor soil, protecting against rill and gully formation from concentrated flows. Vegetation can also help to remove pollutants from storm water through biological uptake of nutrients.
