What's Happening in City Council?

During the month of December, the City Council will only meet once - on the first Wednesday, December 7th. If there are special agenda items that can't wait until January, the City Council may also choose to meet on the 21st, but at the time this newsletter was written, the plan is to only have the meeting on the 7th. Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the meeting on December 7th the Council will continue to consider a variety of issues that they have been working on including the approval of a new/ replacement Development Agreement for the Canyon Gates Subdivision, the approval of the final plans and agreement for the Brookerhaven Senior Living project on 400 East 2100 North, and the final development plan and agreement for the Ashley Court Subdivision on 600 East - 2600 North. The Council will also conduct a public hearing that evening on a proposed large subdivision, Wheatland Hills, the subdivision of 155 Acres for 118 Lots located at about 2200 East between 3100 and 3400 North. The purpose of the public hearing is to receive public input on what things need to be considered before the council considers approval of the concept plan for this new development.

Also during this meeting the council will receive the auditor's report on the FY2016 municipal budget and also receive a report on the results of a survey of city issues that was conducted in October by a class from USU. They will also be considering approval of the North Cache Transportation Corridor Plan, a regional plan for road cross-connections among North Logan, Hyde Park and Smithfield Cities.

The official council agendas as they are posted at the city office and on the State of Utah Public Notice Website at <http://www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html>. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

No Early AM Parking on Streets after November 15th!

We would like to remind everyone that starting **November 15th**, the winter parking ordinance (11-604) will go into effect. This means vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., cannot be parked on city streets, curbs and shoulders between **1:00 am - 5:00 am** on any day. Please let your family and friends know, as well as your renters if you have them, as citations will be issued during these hours. Do not put your garbage/recycling out the night before if it looks like there will be snow during the night. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep your roads clean and safe for you and your family. Avoiding Fraud



The chances are very good that you may be targeted as a possible victim of fraud within the next year. As technology advances it brings resources and information into our lives at a faster and faster rate. It also opens the doors for criminals to creatively attempt to defraud you. During this holiday season criminals work even harder to prey upon our generous spirit. Let me highlight some of the most common scams that we are seeing:

- Using online advertising (KSL.com and Craigslist.org) to sell stolen items
- Someone sees your advertisement on KSL.com and wants to buy the item. They want you to take a check for more than the amount of the asking purchase price and have you forward the balance to another party. Truth is the check they are going to pay you with is fraudulent. They want you to deposit it in your account and then draw funds from your account to forward. You lose when the original check you deposited returns as a fake.
- Criminals striking up a friendship or relationship on the internet. They then present a story as to how they need money.
- Phone callers, posing as a representative from the IRS, and threaten to have you arrested if you do not pay immediate back taxes or penalties.
- Detective Black reminded me to mention, "If you haven't entered the lottery or sweepstakes, you won't be receiving a call that you won!"
- Check your credit card statements regularly to make sure you do not have charges made by someone else.
- Do a credit check to review what credit accounts are attached to your name.

These do not cover all the ways criminals try to defraud us so if you have questions about any activity that you think might be a fraud or scam give us a call (753-7600). If we don't know for sure then we will do some research to determine if it is legitimate. Have a safe and Happy Holiday Season.

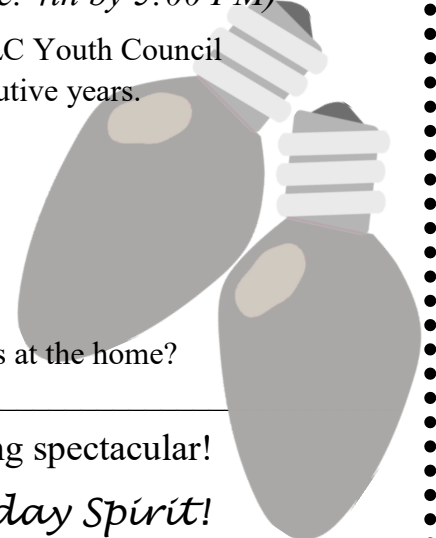

15 Dec: Camera Learn how iPad's camera can help you document memories of activities and people this festive month.

22 Dec: Photos Today learn how to organize those many photos that are meaningful to you for quick access to share with others.

29 Dec: Pioneer's OneClick Digital What a great resource your North Logan library card provides you, in being able to access Utah's On-line Library. Come set up your account with your card number, download the app and download audio books to enjoy no matter what the season. This resource is available for PC's and nearly all smart phones and tablets...Android or iOS. Come prepared with usernames, and passwords you may need to download apps for your device.
