## What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meets on the first and third Wednesdays of each month. August's meetings will therefore be on August 3<sup>rd</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the first meeting in August, the Council will conduct a public hearing to receive public input on proposed changes to the city's property tax allocation and misc. other changes to the FY2017 municipal budget. Being proposed is to reduce the dedicated library tax and increase the general purpose tax such that the result is not net increase in property taxes. Following the hearing the council may consider a resolution adopting the official municipal budget including any updated changes as needed.

The council will also continue to consider a proposed rezone of 4.3 acres of land from R-1-12 Residential zoning to MR-8 (Mixed Residential 8). The property in question surrounds the existing Pioneer Valley Lodge which is part of the North Logan Retirement Residence Subdivision located at approximately 400 East and 2400 North. The Council previously considered a request to rezone this same property, but rezoning it to MXG, (Mixed Use General). The Council will also continue to discuss other possible changes to plans for the city center area including minor changes to the City Center development ordinance.

Other issues which may be considered in August include 1) a development agreement for the Ashley Court Subdivision, a subdivision of 5.18 acres into 12 lots on the east side of a new 600 East and between about 2600 and 2700 North; 2) proposed changes to the municipal code relating to methods to ensure subdivision infrastructure improvements are completed; and 3) some issues related to engineering for regional storm water control.

## STREETS DEPARTMENT

### Benefits of On-site Use of Storm Water

On-site retention, or detention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property. Controlling and reducing the amount of runoff from a site can reduce the risk of flooding as well as reduce the size and extent of drainage infrastructure. The use of vegetation in sustainable storm water management practices provides substantial benefits for water quality and quantity. Vegetation intercepts rainfall, reducing the erosivity of raindrops. Vegetation increases surface friction, slowing runoff and promoting settling of suspended solids. Root systems increase pore space and promote infiltration of storm water, and the roots themselves help to anchor soil, protecting against rill and gully formation from concentrated flows. Vegetation can also help to remove pollutants from storm water through biological uptake of nutrients.

The City may also monitor water usage through real time water meter reports. If a resident, commercial, industrial, or research related water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement standards.

I had the opportunity to visit with a local farmer the other day. As we ended our conversation he asked if there was anything I could do to help in eliminating a reoccurring traffic safety problem. This is my attempt in bringing an awareness so that we might better handle the situations when we confront them. From time to time as we are out travelling in the valley we come across farm implement machinery on the roadway. It is often wide, taking up more than on lane, and travelling at a slower speed. When you find yourself behind such equipment might I suggest some steps to improve safety for everyone.

1. If you notice farm machinery on the road way up ahead that is traveling at a slower speed then try to turn off and take a different route to avoid having to pass into oncoming traffic.
2. Be patient, wait for a safe gap in oncoming traffic to make your move around the equipment.
3. Use your turn signals to communicate that you are moving out and around the equipment.
4. Watch for signs that the equipment may be going to make a turn, like slowing or hand signals by the operator.

We are fortunate to live in communities that still have the open space provided by agriculture. Please be patient and safety conscious as you come upon farm equipment on the roadways.

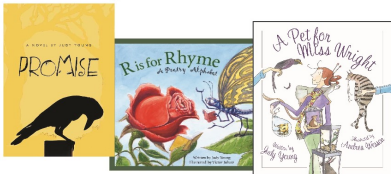
