It’s Summer, school’s out and the time for vacations, picnics, gardening,

Just a few suggestions to help assure that this summer will be the happy
time we all hope for:

WATER: We have been blessed with a good snow year and moist spring.
Now things will likely get hot and dry quickly. Stay well hydrated but other-
wise, when it comes to water usage, be water wise and treat it as the pre-
cious commodity that it is.

MOSQUITOES: Our hot weather on the heels of a moist spring is a perfect
recipe for mosquitoes. Eliminate any sources of standing water and treat
decorative ponds etc. with larvacidal tablets. Wear protective clothing and
wear repellent when mosquitoes are most likely out, in order to avoid the

What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meets on the first and third Wednesdays of each month. July's meetings will therefore be on July 6th and 20th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the first meeting in July, the Council will conduct two public hearings. The first will be a hearing to allow citizens to provide input on a proposed annexation of several parcels between North Logan and Hyde Park from about 2850 to 3100 North and from about 1000 to 1200 East. The second public hearing will be to allow citizens to provide input on establishing the Cache Water District.

The council will also continue to consider a proposed rezone of 4.3 acres of land from R-1-12 Residential zoning to MXG Mixed-use General zoning. The property in question surrounds the existing Pioneer Valley Lodge which is part of the North Logan Retirement Residence Subdivision located at approximately 400 East and 2400 North. The Council will also continue to discuss other possible changes to plans for the city center area including minor changes to the City Center development ordinance.

With the passage in June of a tentative municipal budget for the new fiscal year, the City Council is proposing a change in the property tax for our coming tax year. Now that the final payment has been made on the bond for constructing the city library building, the council is planning to reduce the dedicated library tax and then increase the general purpose property tax an equal amount such that the total property tax rate being paid to the city does not change. With the library building bond paid off, the council wanted to use those available funds to not only allow for some improvements in what the library could do with increased funds, but to also make a slight increase in what could be available to the general fund. A Truth in Taxation Hearing will be held August 3rd to provide an opportunity for the citizens to give their input on this change in the property taxes.

The official council agendas as they are posted at the city office and on the State of Utah Public Notice Website at <http://www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html>. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

If a resident, commercial, industrial, or research related water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement standards.</p>

HOW TO PREVENT CONTAMINATION OF YOUR DRINKING WATER

In light of what has happened recently in other cities, North Logan City wants to inform residents of things we all can do to prevent contamination.

Water normally flows in one direction, from the public water system through the customer's cold or hot water plumbing to a sink tap or other plumbing fixture. The plumbing fixture is the end of the potable water system and the start of the waste disposal system.

Under certain conditions, water can flow in the reverse direction. This is known as **backflow**. Backflow occurs when a back-siphonage or backpressure condition is created in a water line.

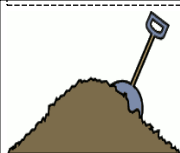
YOU CAN PROTECT YOUR DRINKING WATER BY TAKING THE FOLLOWING PRECAUTIONS:

DON'T:

- Submerge hoses in buckets, pools, tubs, sinks, ponds, etc.
- Use spray attachments without a backflow prevention device
- Connect waste pipes from water softeners or other treatment systems to the sewer, submerged drain pipe, etc.
- Use a hose to unplug blocked toilets, sewers, etc.

Do:

- ◇ Keep the ends of hoses clear of all possible contaminants
- ◇ If not already equipped with an integral (built-in) vacuum breaker, buy and install hose bib type vacuum breakers on all threaded faucets around your home. These devices are inexpensive and are available at hardware stores and home improvement centers
- ◇ Install an approved backflow prevention assembly on all underground lawn irrigation systems. Remember, a plumbing permit is required for the connection of an underground lawn irrigation system to your plumbing



Stormwater Concern:

We are asking the residents of North Logan to please **not** place piles of topsoil, mulch, wood-chips, gravel, dirt, tree limbs, or landscaping materials of any kind in the **curb** or **roadway**. A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.

The Cache Mosquito Abatement District reminds residents:

The Cache MAD uses an [Integrated Pest Management Program](#) to control mosquitoes. This program is reviewed before, during, and after each season not only by the trustees and the Bear River Health Department but also by toxicologists, pest management specialists, veterinary pathologists, and pesticide specialists to ensure the District gets the maximum benefit for mosquito control with the least impact on health and the environment. The fogging schedule for North Logan City is for Thursdays.



There are many things you can do around your home to help control mosquitoes. Drain standing water around your house. Clogged gutters, children's toys, pet water dishes, birdbaths: it only takes a small amount of water (half a cup!) to provide a breeding area for thousands of mosquitoes. Empty pet dishes and bird baths a couple of times a week to get rid of any mosquito eggs or larva.

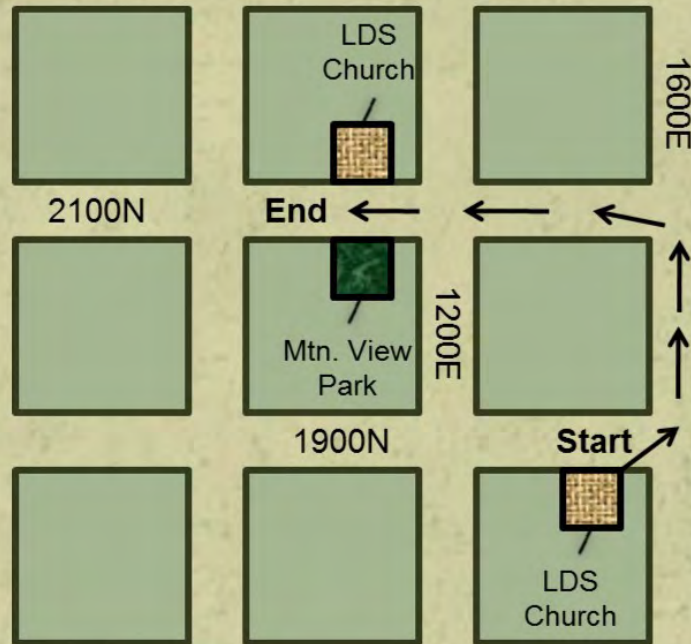
