Note: The constitutional and statutory qualification requirements for municipal office are:

- 1) Be a United States citizen at time of filing.
- 2) Be at least 18 years old at the time of the next municipal election.
- 3) Must be a registered voter of the municipality.
- 4) Must be a resident of the municipality or a resident of a recently annexed area for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election.
- 5) In accordance with Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to hold elective office is restored as provided by statute (see 20A-2-101.5).
