Note: The constitutional and statutory qualification requirements for municipal office are:

- 1) Be a United States citizen at time of filing.
2) Be at least 18 years old at the time of the next municipal election.
3) Must be a registered voter of the municipality.
4) Must be a resident of the municipality or a resident of a recently annexed area for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election.
5) In accordance with Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to hold elective office is restored as provided by statute (see 20A-2-101.5).
