

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

We are excited to be back this summer with a full spate of activities for the July 24th Holiday. This year we are following the city's tradition of holding our celebrations on the day of the state holiday, so our activities will be on Friday, July 23rd. We are excited to gather again for our parade, games in the park, and the activities that we missed last year. We have arranged for a mobile vaccine clinic during our games at the park on the 23rd and invite anyone who would like to receive a COVID-19 vaccine to receive it at that time.

As the summer wears on, we are feeling a strain on our water system. We are implementing a plan that the City Council put in place over a year ago now to build new reservoirs and an additional well. I believe these measures will secure our water needs for another decade, but we are still finishing the engineering phase of those projects, so they won't come online this summer. We need the continued vigilant support of our residents to conserve water. The biggest demand on our water system in the summers is outdoor watering, and the drought conditions mean we're going to see a lot of brown lawns this summer. Indoor conservation efforts can also be important; where feasible, please consider taking showers instead of baths, running dishwashers and laundry machines only with full loads, and generally being conservation minded. We'll get through this together, but we each need to do our part to conserve.

**GOVERNMENT MEETINGS** (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council Meeting will take place on Wednesday, July 14th at 6:30 p.m. (Please note, there will only be one City Council Meeting held in July.) The City Council will hold a public hearing to discuss potential roads that would be on a Council of Governments (COG) Application for funding in August 2021. The City Council will consider an ordinance regarding the Disproportionate Business License, along with an ordinance updating the requirements for Internal Accessory Dwelling Units.

The Planning Commission Meeting will take place on Thursday, July 15th at 6:30 p.m. (Please note, there will only be one Planning Commission Meeting held in July.) The Planning Commission will be discussing potential changes to setback requirements in the industrial zone, along with modifications to the requirements for storage units and the zones in which they are permitted.

Cache Recreation Complex Pickleball Courts (2850N 300E): 8 Pickleball Courts will be installed at the Cache Recreation Complex. These 8 Pickleball courts will be completed by late summer.

Playground at Elk Ridge Park: As you may have seen, the playground and swing sets have been removed from Elk Ridge Park. The removed items were outdated and unsafe. We have plans to expand the existing playground and have ordered all of the equipment. We are very excited about the coming features. It should be installed by the beginning of August.

Parking Lot at Elk Ridge East (2300N 1200E): We are currently working on the final touches to the parking lot and will have it paved soon. There will also be segments of trail done to complete an exterior loop around Elk Ridge Park.

3100 North Roadway: This project has been 90% completed. We will be finishing small projects on this roadway throughout the next month. Thank you for your patience!

300 E: Waterline and road work are underway on 300 E. This is a big project and we thank the residents for their understanding and cooperation. This should be completed in July.

STREETS

For July we will be chip-sealing on the 19th and 20th; possibly into the 21st. The roads we are treating will be:

- 1600 N by Walmart (Main St. to 200 E)
- 1550 N and 1350 E (1200 E to 1500 N)
- View Crest Circle
- Juniper Circle
- Mahogany Ridge Subdivision.
- Everything north of 3100 N and east of 1600 E

July 12th we are going to be doing a friction-seal demo on 1800 E (3100 N to 3200 N). Also, on 1600 E (3450 N to 3600 N).

For all of these surface treatments we will be closing down the roads. Expect delays. Thank you for your patience!

FIREWORKS - REGULATIONS

Due to drought conditions, the discharging of fireworks will not be allowed for the following areas and dates this year:

East Bench Area:

- East of 1600 East from the northern city boundary to the southern city boundary.

Dates of Restrictions:

- June 24, 2021 through July 25, 2021.

What is Allowed:

- Fireworks may be discharged between the hours of 11:00 a.m. - 11:00 p.m., July 2 - July 5 (hours are extended to midnight on July 4) and July 22-July 25 (hours are extended midnight on July 24).
- Fireworks are legally sold from June 24-July 25.

NOTICE

North Logan City Culinary Water User Conservation Measures June 2021

The City Council with the Public Utility Division informs the public that the City is experiencing moderate drought conditions. And all indications are that this condition will extend for the rest of the water season. If current conditions or conditions change, City staff may implement stricter water conservation measures.

Water Conservation Measures: A City-wide reduction of exterior water usage of 30-40%.

Public Education and Requirements: Water users must cut back exterior watering by 30-40%. (Users shall water no more than three days per week, and are encouraged to water less than three days where possible.) Odd addresses water on Monday, Wednesday, Friday; Even addresses water on Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday. No watering on Sunday.

- No washing of cars using culinary water at a home/residence.
- No spraying sidewalks, driveways, etc. with a hose.
- No excessive or wasteful watering.
- City's splash pads will be reduced to 6 hours/day until conditions dictate a change in operation. (For the Splash Pad schedule, you can check the City website for details at northlogancity.org.)

Written Warning: If a water user is observed using inordinate amounts of water or is ignoring the rules and regulations set out in the City's water shortage policies, procedures, and the associated water shortage phase reduction strategies, the property owner will be notified of the violation by a letter, door hanger and/or E-Mail from the City Public Utility. The first written warning will explain to the property owner that the City has adopted a conservation program that educates and assists property owners to conserve water. The warning will further explain that the property owner has been observed using more water than what seems necessary and may be in violation of City Water Shortage Policies. The warning will be accompanied by education materials (or a link to the City's education materials) and tips on how to conserve water.

Violation: After two written warnings have been given to a given water user, and if the user continues in violation of the City's water conservation and water shortage policies, the violating user's water will be shut off. In order for a user's water to be turned on after a water shortage violation shut-off has occurred, the user must pay a water turn-on fee of \$100. A second violation will result in a shut-off of the water, and a subsequent turn-on fee of \$300. The City Public Utility Manager recognizes that there are special circumstances when a property owner may need to deviate from water shortage policies. One of those instances may be to ensure the survival of newly planted landscaping and lawn. The Public Utility Manager will have the ability to allow for special watering where property owners can show unusual or extraordinary circumstances requiring more water than is permitted by a particular phase reduction strategy. However, special circumstances will not be considered if the City has implemented phase IV or V of the water shortage policies.

Let's all work together to conserve, so that more restrictive measures don't have to be taken. One thing we all need to remember is that we live in a desert, and water is a precious resource and not an unlimited supply. Please be wise with water use this summer.
