

## PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS** Utah and Cache Valley have had historically low rainfall this water year; and

**WHEREAS** Utah, Cache Valley, and the broader Western U.S. are in a protracted drought and have had low precipitation for multiple consecutive years; and

**WHEREAS** drought conditions have diminished the amount of water available for culinary uses; and

**WHEREAS** hotter than average temperatures early in this season have led to increased demand for water; and

**WHEREAS** Governor Cox has declared a state of emergency in Utah due to the drought conditions; and


**WHEREAS** our cities wish to conserve water and provide for availability of water for our residents, and


**WHEREAS** differences in cities needs, distribution systems and sources of water exist


### **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

- The cities signed to this agreement call on their residents to reduce their water use, enabling conservation of our precious water resources.
- The cities call on residents to voluntarily reduce water consumption through measures such as:
  - Follow city and state guidelines for water conservation, including the number of days per week to water.
  - Do not water during the heat of the day when water is lost to evaporation
  - Taking showers rather than baths
  - Repairing leaking faucets, toilets or other water-using fixtures
  - Running dishwashers and laundry machines only when full.
- As summer wears on and conditions unfold, the cities may promulgate additional voluntary and/or mandatory conservation measures consistent with the unique needs from ways the drought impacts their water sources, treatment plants, and distribution systems.
