### GOVERNMENT MEETINGS

During the month of June the City Council will only meet one time rather than the normal twice. They will meet on the third Wednesday, June 21<sup>st</sup>. Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library. The normal meeting that would have been held the first Wednesday in June was held early, May 31<sup>st</sup>, because of the North Logan City Library's Summer Reading Program Kick-off.

During the June 21<sup>st</sup> meeting the council will complete the process to approve the FY2018 municipal budget and a final revision to the FY2017 budget. Public hearings on the budget were held during the May 31<sup>st</sup> meeting.

During the June meetings the Council also plans to continue work on a variety of open issues including possible changes to the City Center zoning regulations, other interlocal and development agreements, plus miscellaneous ordinance changes.

## PUBLIC SAFETY

It is hard to believe that summer is upon us. With school out I thought it would be a good idea to review the curfew ordinance with everyone. On weekdays from Sunday to Friday Morning the curfew is 10:30 PM to 5:00 AM. On Friday and Saturday night the curfew is 12:00 midnight and 5:00 AM. Curfew applies to those who are under the age of 18. The following are exceptions to the ordinance if the person under the age of 18:

**CURFEW**

1. Married;
2. Accompanied by a parent, guardian or other adult person having care of such minor;
3. Returning home from, going to, or being in attendance at any religious or school function, organized dance, theater, sports event or other such associational activity; provided however that going to or from such activity shall be by a direct route and within a reasonable time of the commencement or termination of such event;
4. Engaged in a legitimate emergency errand;
5. Engaged in legitimate employment and can produce evidence of such employment; or in a motor vehicle engaged in normal travel, while traveling to, from, or through the city on an interstate trip.

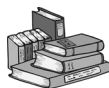
