MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Spring is coming! What a winter it has been. One of the key issues for the city this spring is how fast warming temperatures turn snowmelt into fast moving waters that can impact our city. The City has enhanced its storm water mitigation plans and some of our storm water control facilities, which we hope will handle the effects of excess water.

The winter was particularly hard on our roads and we see a higher number of potholes and road damage than we typically might expect. Some of these problem areas have been addressed with a "cold fill" asphalt product, a temporary solution, which will need to be replaced with a hot asphalt application once the asphalt plants begin production later in the springtime. As soon as we are able to acquire the "hot" product, we will begin the repairs in these badly needed areas. In the meantime keep a sharp eye out for pot holes as you are driving in North Logan and elsewhere. Hopefully UDOT will soon be fixing the road at about 3000 North Main Street.

Don't forget, our Easter Egg Hunt is coming up on April 15th at 11:00 am sharp at Elk Ridge Park. Bring the kids and help them enjoy this annual event. The Easter Bunny plans on being there and will be able to take pictures with those little ones. Just a reminder to be on time. The event takes about one minute for the kids to pick up all the eggs so you need to be there when it kicks off.

I would also like to congratulate Jordan Oldham as our new Public Works Director. Jordan was born in North Logan City, and after graduating from USU, he was hired as the Assistant Superintendent of the Logan Golf and Country Club. He moved to greener pastures in 2012, as he was hired as the North Logan City Parks Manager, and he was later promoted to Parks, Recreation, and Facilities Director in 2014. Jordan has been instrumental in the doubling of our recreation programs, along with the coordination of the amazing park improvements that are currently taking place throughout the City. We are looking for great things from Jordan as he takes over all of Public Works.

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS

During the month of April the City Council will meet on the first Wednesday, April 5th and the third Wednesday, April 19th. Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During both April meetings the council will continue the process to develop the FY2018 municipal budget with presentations on budget proposals from department heads and various city agencies. During the April 5th meeting they will be reviewing the Storm Water, Facilities, and various administrative departments' budgets. During the April 19th meeting they will discuss the Streets, Water, and Sewer Departments' budgets.

Also during the April 5th meeting the council will consider an ordinance rezoning Lots 8 and 9 of the Cache Recreation Complex Subdivision, land owned by Cache County. The property is located north and south of 2850 N. and west of Wolfpack Way (west of the Eccles Ice Center and Green Canyon High School) which is currently zoned Recreation/School (RS). Being proposed is that the area be rezoned to General Commercial (CG) Zone.

During the April meetings the Council also plans to continue work on variety of open issues including possible changes to the City Center zoning regulations, other interlocal and development agreements, plus miscellaneous ordinance changes including pending re-zone requests.

STREETS

STORM AND WINTER RUNOFF—KEEP CURBS AND GUTTERS FREE OF DEBRIS

Curb and gutters should be free from dirt, rocks and debris so that the runoff can get to the drains. Please help us keep the drains clean. PUBLIC SAFETY

I wanted to take a minute and talk about riding off-highway vehicles. Throughout the summer we receive complaints about individuals riding four wheelers and motorcycles on private property or on public property that is restricted in use. Designated open space within subdivisions is often restricted to non-motorized vehicles. The simple rule is that if you do not own the property then you need to locate the owner or controlling agent and get permission to ride. You must obtain **WRITTEN** permission and have it on your person while you are riding. Just because there are visible trails in the foothills does not mean there is open riding. Be considerate and get permission first, it's the Law.

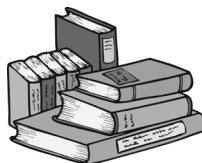
