MAYOR'S MESSAGE

As summer comes to a close, the school year approaches. For all of us, this is a reminder to be especially careful when driving during the morning and afternoon school transit times. Also, for those of us with school-aged kids, let's take a moment to talk to them about rules for safe transit to school, including safe routes to school, bike safety, and caution with strangers. Cache County School District has realigned grades and boundaries of our elementary schools due to changes associated with the opening of Green Canyon High School, so please be aware that some students will be finding their ways along new routes to their school or their bus stop.

As the return to school brings change, there will also be changes in how sewer disposal is handled in Cache Valley. Several years ago, the EPA passed new regulations that required replacing the lagoon-style sewer treatment plant with a new mechanical treatment plant. These requirements from the federal government have required some major expenditures from Logan, North Logan, and the other cities that had been using the lagoons for sewer disposal, which in turn will result in higher sewer fees. We have worked for several years to find ways to best minimize the impact of this increase, but because of the substantial cost of complying with the federal regulations, we will experience a significant increase - it is expected that when all improvements and costs are accounted for, the average residential user will experience an increase of \$20-\$25 on the sewer portion of their bill. We don't take these increases lightly. Mayor Berentzen and others from the city invested many hours in meetings and negotiations with many entities, including Logan City and the state Water Quality Board. Those efforts ensured that we have a seat at the table on the rate-setting board to advocate for North Logan and the other cities that work with Logan for sewer service. STORMWATER

Benefits of On-site Storm Water

On-site retention, or detention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property. Controlling and reducing the amount of runoff from a site can reduce the risk of flooding as well as reduce the size and extent of drainage infrastructure. The use of vegetation in sustainable storm water management practices provides substantial benefits for water quality and quantity. Vegetation intercepts rainfall, reducing the erosivity of raindrops. Vegetation increases surface friction, slowing runoff and promoting settling of suspended solids. Root systems increase pore space and promote infiltration of storm water, and the roots themselves help to anchor soil, protecting against rill and gully formation from concentrated flows. Vegetation can also help to remove pollutants from storm water through biological uptake of nutrients.

PUBLIC SAFETY

With school starting at the end of August, I thought it would be good to remind us of some driving rules that will help us be prepared for more pedestrians and bicyclists on the roadway and sidewalks. We have crossing guards at the location of 2500 N and 800 E, two at 2500 N 400 E, two at 2600 N 200 E, one at 2900 N 800 E and two new crossings in Hyde Park at 200 West and Hyde Park Lane and 200 West 200 North. children and adults escorting children to school to use the cross walks manned by our crossing guards. Drivers, be aware that when a crossing guard is positioned in the middle of a cross walk the entire crosswalk is activated and vehicles cannot pass through it. Crossing guards are trained and are required to stand in the middle of the cross walk and wait till the children are up on the curb on the opposite side before they can turn and walk back to their starting position. Be patient and take your time when driving.

PROPOSED SEWER USER FEE INCREASE

In order to comply with updated pollutant discharge mandates from the EPA and the State of Utah, Logan City is required to construct a mechanical wastewater treatment plant to replace the existing passive Logan City lagoon system that does not meet the updated discharge mandates. This new mechanical treatment plant will be paid for through a combination of grants, low interest loans, along with user fees from residents - like you.

North Logan City is one of seven cities that discharges to the existing passive lagoons that are owned and operated by Logan City. When North Logan City was made aware of the need for a potential new mechanical wastewater treatment plant, endless efforts were made to evaluate additional options for North Logan City, including a separate mechanical treatment plant that could potentially reduce future user fees. However, each of these options proved to be more expensive and/or unattainable through the State of Utah.

Coincidentally, North Logan City will be required to participate in the cost of the new Logan City wastewater treatment plant. Unfortunately, this means that individual user fees will need to be raised.

Below you will find a five year proposal of the rough estimated increase in sewer user fees that will be implemented in September of 2017. The exact increases will be determined over the next five years:

Year	Average Sewer User Fee
Present	\$30/Month

Year	Percent Increase (From Current)	New Average Sewer User Fee
2017 (Starting in September)	50%	\$45/Month
2018	60%	\$48/Month
2019	60%	\$48/Month
2020	70%	\$51/Month
2021+	70%	\$51/Month
