After 32 years of dedicated service, North Logan City's Water Treatment Plant Manager, Terrel Huppi has decided to retire. Through those 32 years, Terrel has played a major role in every department within Public Works including water, sewer, parks and recreation, facilities, and storm water. This "Jack of all Trades" with his variety of talents and abilities will certainly be missed by the North Logan

City staff and all of the citizens of North Logan City.

North Logan City was incorporated in 1934 in order to secure water rights in Green Canyon. In the early 1980s a culinary water treatment plant was installed to filter the water coming out of Green and Water Canyons. Since the early 1980s, Terrel Huppi has been the point person to ensure that the operation of that treatment plant remains on target, and to make sure that the water system distributes that culinary water safely to all of the homes and businesses in North Logan. Even though Terrel has more recently had his focus on the water treatment plant, he has used his talents over the years to help maintain the City's sewer system, along with maintenance and repair of the City's waterlines and its many water reservoirs. For several years, Terrel was the manager of our parks and was instrumental in many of the improvements we enjoy today at Elk Ridge Park, Meadow View Park, and King Nature Park.

In order to thank Terrel for doing his part in providing us with tens of billions of gallons of some of the best water in the State, and developing the most used parks in Cache Valley, the City will hold an open-house at noon on March 31, 2017 at the North Logan City Library. Please, swing by that day and thank Terrel for all of the services he has diligently provided North Logan over the past 32 years.

What's Happening in City Council?

During the month of March the City Council will meet on the first Wednesday, March 1st and the third Wednesday, March 15th. Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During meeting on March 1st the Council will continue the process to develop the FY2018 municipal budget with presentations on budget proposals from department heads and various city agencies. During the March 1st meeting they will be reviewing the Parks and Recreation Department's budget. During the March 15th meeting they will discuss the Community Development, Cemetery, and Building Inspector's Departments' budgets.

Also during the March 1st meeting the council will continue to discuss a proposed ordinance that makes amendments to the subdivision ordinance establishing requirements for street lighting in new subdivisions.

During the March 1st the Council also plans to consider a development plan and ancillary agreement for the Four Seasons Apartments expansion to be constructed on the ten acres located at approximately 2000-2100 N. and 100-200 E.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

Crime Prevention Month

As a young officer in the early 1980's I was taught a principle of crime prevention that still applies today and that I would like to highlight this month. For a crime to be committed three things need to be present: First, the individual must have the desire to commit the crime. Second, they must have the skill. The third and the last element is opportunity. Now as citizens we have very little influence over a criminal's desire or skill but we do have a great deal of influence over the opportunity side of the equation. In the past several days we have had two purses taken out of shopping carts while the owners were shopping. When you are out in the community be aware of your surroundings. We have the same occurrence with citizens having their vehicles burglarized. The criminals do not need the skill of unlocking cars because most of these vehicles were left unlocked. The owners of the vehicles provided the thieves with an opportunity. I encourage you to look around your home and evaluate your habits. Do you provide opportunities for potential criminals to make you a victim? Do you secure your vehicles? Are your homes secured properly? Have you discussed with your children what to do when confronted with suspicious situations? Let's be active in removing some of the opportunities that criminals look for.
