UTILITES

If you have a sprinkler system connected to the City water line, it's that time of the year to drain your system and blow out your lines to protect from freezing. When you turn off your sprinkler system, please make **SURE IT IS TURNED OFF ALL THE WAY**. If left on even a quarter of a turn, water can leak out your stop and waste valve all winter long.

STREETS




No Early AM Parking on Streets after Nov. 15th!

We would like to remind everyone that starting **November 15th**, the winter parking ordinance (11-604) will go into effect. This means vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., cannot be parked on city streets, curbs and shoulders between **1:00 am - 5:00 am** on any day. Please let your family and friends know, as well as your renters if you have them, as citations will be issued during these hours. Do not put your garbage/recycling out the night before if it looks like there will be snow during the night. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep your roads clean and safe for you and your family. TREE TRIMMING

 For all residents, especially those located on 1650 North, we ask that you please trim your trees back to the edge of the roadway. This is being asked due to the winter months approaching. When snow piles on the tree limbs it forces them to hang even lower. Then, when the snowplow comes through, the branches hit the headlights and mirrors causing them to break.

STORMWATER

- Regularly clean/sweep parking lots to prevent debris run-off
- Inspect & clean inlets and catch basins of any debris
- Install oil/water separators, chemical separators, snouts, or other appropriate filtration devices

STORMWATER CONTINUED

- Limit the amount of pesticides and herbicides applied to lawn, park strips, and landscaped areas
- Eliminate excessive use of fertilizers to landscaping. Sweep up excess fertilizer rather than hosing it away
- Verify that wash bay facilities are draining to sanitary sewer and not to storm drains
- Cover loaded trucks to prevent items from blowing out and entering storm drain systems
- Minimize the use of de-icing salts or use alternate methods for snow removal
- Cover trash containers to prevent garbage migration via wind and/or animals to storm water system
- Regularly inspect and maintain vehicles to make sure no fluids are leaking that would pollute storm drain systems

ANNUAL CEMETERY FLOWER & DECORATION REMOVAL

On Nov. 22nd the City will discard all decorations and flowers from the Cemetery that appear out of condition or are not in compliance with the City's Cemetery Ordinance, including shepherds hooks. This cleaning takes place semi-annually after Memorial Day and Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance please go to the City website, www.northlogancity.org.

"Glass containers are prohibited...small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, flowers, decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain **within the 6" concrete base** (mowing strip) on the **north and/or south** of the headstone/monument. Shepherds hooks, pinwheels, etc. are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone, mowing strip. All decorations, vases, toys, et., are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed."
