Alan has been with the city for nine years moving up from our city's GIS Analyst, to our Parks, Rec and Facilities Director as well as our Cemetery Sexton before taking on the responsibility of all of Public Works. Alan is a valedictorian USU graduate with a B.S in Geography and a minor in GIS and Spanish plus a Masters Degree in Bioregional Planning. Many of the improvements in Elk Ridge Park, the Cemetery, and the city's water system can be attributed to Alan's leadership. He has already made significant changes to the way the city does things, especially taking advantage of new technology applications. You will get to know Alan as one who is very conservative with spending the tax payer's dollar. We look forward to him continuing to help us keep North Logan a *Great Place to Call Home*.

What's Happening in City Council?

During the month of February the City Council will meet on the first Wednesday, February 1st and the third Wednesday, February 15th. Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During meeting on February 1st the Council will hold a public hearing to receive input on a proposed revisions to the city's FY2017 budget. This is a typical mid-year correction to the budget. This had been originally planned for January but was moved to this spot in February. Both of February's meetings will also see the council beginning the process to develop the FY2018 municipal budget with presentations on budget proposals from department heads and various city agencies.

Also during the February 1st meeting the council will continue to discuss a proposed ordinance that makes amendments to the subdivision ordinance designating the Planning Commission as the land use authority for North Logan City.

During the February 1st the Council also plans to consider approval of the proposed revised development agreement and concept plan for the Canyon Gates Subdivision, the development of the remaining 120.79 acres into a maximum of 233 lots located between 1600 and 2200 E and 2000 and 2400 N. The official council agendas as they are posted at the city office and on the State of Utah Public Notice Website at <http://www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html>. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

STREETS DEPARTMENT



We would like to remind everyone that the winter parking ordinance (11-604) is still in effect. This means vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., **cannot** be parked on city streets, curbs and shoulders between **1:00 am - 5:00 am** on any day. Please let your **family and friends know, as well as your**

renters if you have them, as citations will be issued during these hours. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep the roads clean and safe for you and your family.

Did You Know it is against City Ordinance to push snow into the road? When clearing your driveways and sidewalks, DO NOT push snow or snow-blow into the road. Doing this can cause dangerous bumps which can turn to ice, causing accidents, injuries and property damage for citizens and snow plow operators. Please do your part to keep the roadways clear by pushing snow into your yard instead of the road. Thank you!

Benefits of On-site Use of Storm Water

On-site retention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention, or detention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property. Controlling and reducing the amount of runoff from a site can reduce the risk of flooding as well as reduce the size and extent of drainage infrastructure. The use of vegetation in sustainable storm water management practices provides substantial benefits for water quality and quantity. Vegetation intercepts rainfall, reducing the erosivity of raindrops. Vegetation increases surface friction, slowing runoff and promoting settling of suspended solids. Root systems increase pore space and promote infiltration of storm water, and the roots themselves help to anchor soil, protecting against rill and gully formation from concentrated flows. Vegetation can also help to remove pollutants from storm water through biological uptake of nutrients.

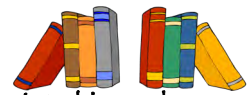
