### **MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

This month I would like to focus on the future city center and the opportunity that North Logan has to place at the heart of this land a future Town Building. The vision of this landmark is to incorporate 3 unique and distinctive uses. A Library, a Children's Museum and a Black Box Theatre. The existing library would be turned into the future North Logan City Offices. The idea is to accomplish this with no additional tax burden using only existing resources along with generous land and financial donations. How is this possible?

North Logan owns 2.5 acres in the heart of the City Center area. There has been interest by one of the landowners to donate 1 to 2 acres of additional land. We have also been fortunate to receive a financial commitment of 3 million dollars from a generous donor. Additionally, the resources that have been committed to paying off the library bond are now available because the bond has been paid in full. The children's museum portion of this will be paid for by valley businesses, industries and innovative professions which are all committed to providing one of the most unique hands on learning environments for our children and families. We would also like to utilize a fundraiser with the goal of raising an additional \$2 million. All in all, the total project is estimated to run approximately \$12 million dollars. The resources needed are planned or in place. So where do we go from here?

We need you! The details of this vision are yet to be accomplished. In the coming months, please come to public hearings, workshops, and give your input. A lot of work has been done to make this financially viable without additional burden on our citizenry. Now we need to come together and cultivate, nurture, and move it to a reality. We look forward to getting as many of you involved as possible.

### UTILITIES

#### Disconnect (shut-off) Notices Changes:



Anyone behind two months on their utility bill receive a disconnect notice. These notices were previously sent via the postal service but we will not longer send notices through the postal service. All notices will be sent via email or text. Please make sure your current information (email address and phone numbers) are on file with the city to avoid your water service being disconnected without notice to you. Thank you.

### STORMWATER

#### Water Pollution and Leaves:

Fall is in the air and that means it's time to clean up those leaves in your yard. As you do, please remember to NOT put grass clippings, leaves, and yard debris in the street, storm drain, or ditch. Littering with your yard debris can cause problems for your water. drains can clog, streets can flood, and water can become polluted. To avoid this, using clippings and leaves as fertilizer or use a mulching lawn mower. Maybe try composting, or call 435-716-9755 to sign up for a green waste container for \$4.00 per month (weekly pick up April - November). Please be considerate while cleaning up your yards this fall season. Thank you!

### PUBLIC SAFETY

In an effort to serve you better, North Logan Fire Dept. is requesting that residents post their street numbers on their homes and mailboxes.

#### Suggested guidelines:

- \* The numbers on residences should be at least 3 inches high and the numbers on businesses should be at least 4 inches high.

### PUBLIC SAFETY CONTINUED...

- \* Numbers should be a contrasting color to the background.
- \* Numbers should be placed on, above, or at the side of the main entrance, so that they can be easily detected from the street.
- \* If the entrance is more than 50 feet from the street, or cannot be seen from the street, a second set of numbers should also be displayed on the mailbox or on a post at the street or end of the drive.
- \* Reflective numbers are highly recommended.

At the very least, any house number is better than none at all.

they always wear a seat belt. Utah crash data show that unrestrained crash occupants were over 30 times more likely to be killed than restrained crash occupants. Even while driving close to home and at slow speeds, vehicles can roll over. Seat belts are critical protection during a roll over.

We are encouraged by the fact that most people in our county always wear a seat belt. However, we need to work together and make sure that it is everyone, all the time. Regretfully, our officers still respond to crashes in which people have been needlessly killed or seriously injured because they were not wearing a seat belt.

By working together on this issue, we can save lives, reduce our auto and health insurance rates, and protect those we care about. Speak up about seat belts. Make sure you and those you care about always wear a seat belt. Always ask others in the vehicle with you to buckle up.
