GOVERNMENT MEETINGS

The City Council meets on the first and third Wednesdays of each month, unless otherwise posted. The City Council meetings start at 6:30pm and are held in the Council Meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the Month of August the City Council will have a report on the status of trails in North Logan City from the Cache County Trails Planner, Dayton Crites.

The City Council will also look at a proposal to modify the subdivision process. This proposed process is intended to increase the amount of oversight and review by the City staff, along with the elected/appointed City officials. Similarly, the new process will give additional notification to existing residents regarding proposed developments in their particular area.

One of the items that will be a major point of discussion in the coming months will be the City's Sewer user rates. Logan City is currently in the process of installing a new wastewater mechanical treatment plant. With this installation, North Logan City will be required to participate in the cost of the new plant. Coincidentally, our sewer user rates will need to increase by approximately 30-40%. This will most likely be a gradual increase over the next five years.

Planning Commission:

Planning Commission will continue the process with various subdivision proposals, along with updates regarding the City Center zoning discussion. In addition, the commission will continue their discussion of developmental fees to be charged to the developer.

One other point of discussion in the coming months will be in relation to the City's Design Standards. The commission will look at road cross section standards and the associated street tree standards.

WASTEWATER RATES

North Logan City's sewer user rates are based on each user's average culinary water usage during the winter months. Every year, user rates are adjusted based on this average. This notice is simply to remind you that if your sewer rates have changed this month, it is due to an increase or decrease in your winter water average usage.

CULINARY WATER NOTICE

We are implementing phase 2 - the yellow level - Moderate drought, from our Water Shortage Management Policies and Procedures Plan.

Target: Water Use Reduction:
A city wide reduction of water usage of 15-20%.

Reduction Strategies:

- Water users must cut back exterior watering by 15% (i.e. users shall water no more than three days per week).
- Commercial, Industrial, and Research Buildings cut back by 15% on all water usage (both inside/outside usage).
- No washing of cars using culinary water at a residence.
- No spraying sidewalks, driveways..etc. with a hose.
- No excessive/wasteful watering.
- Splash pad will be reduced to 6 hours/day.

The City may also monitor water usage through real time water meter reports. If a resident, commercial, industrial, or research related water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement Standards.

STORMWATER CONCERN

We are asking the residents of North Logan to please **not** place piles of topsoil, mulch, woodchips, gravel, dirt, tree limbs, or landscaping materials of any kind in the **curb** or **roadway**. A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes and canals, which may cause future flooding

concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.













IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

North Logan City Did Not Meet Treatment Requirements. Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although the situation does NOT require you take action, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct the situation. Disinfection Residual- We Routinely Monitor for disinfection residual in our distribution system. This measurement tells us whether we are effectively disinfecting the water supply. Disinfectant residual is the amount of chlorine or related disinfectant present in the pipes of the distribution system. If the amount of disinfectant is too low, organisms could be present. On May 3rd, 6th, and 7th 2017, disinfectant levels dropped below 0.2 milligrams per liter for 24, 5, and 5 Hours respectively. The Standard is that levels may not drop below 0.2 for more than four hours. WE CONTINUOUSLY SAMPLE DISINFECTANT LEVELS AND HAVE ADJUSTED THE AMOUNT OF DISINFECTANT ADDED TO MAINTAIN ADEQUATE LEVELS. WHAT DOES THIS MEAN? This situation does not require you to take immediate action, if it had been, you would have been notified immediately. Tests taken during this same time period did not indicate the presence of bacteria in the water. Inadequately treated water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites which can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches. These symptoms, however, are not caused only by organisms in drinking water, but also by many other factors. WHAT HAPPENED? WHAT IS BEING DONE? The low chlorine levels occurred during the peak of spring runoff. There was Chlorine in the system just not an adequate level of chlorine residual. Our system has been in compliance since May 8, 2017. We have improved the chlorine delivery system and changed dosing rates to make sure we are at adequate levels. Disinfectant residual levels for this month have met all requirements. For more information, please contact Jordan Oldham at 435-752-1310 ext 16. Please share this information with all other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, apartment, nursing homes, schools and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
