Recently I had the opportunity to participate in the ribbon cutting for the expansion of the new Walt USA, LLC. Most of us know this company as the Sock factory. The first phase of the expansion will give the company 75,000 square feet of manufacturing space with two more expansions to go. While there, I met a gentleman named Ken Ong and his wife Hillary. He was an unassuming individual of slight build, gracious and kind in his manner, as he introduced himself to me. I went on to meet the Company Manager and the Chief Operating Officer along with representatives from Nike and others. After mingling for a few minutes I was motioned to take my seat in the front having been asked to say a few words on the program. As I did so, Ken and Hillary sat next to me. Then the Company manager began the short program by introducing Ken, the owner of Walt USA. As I mentioned before, Ken was so unassuming that I had no idea he was the owner of this international company with 7 manufacturing plants around the world employing thousands of people.

Ken is definitely a visionary. The company is not just about socks but also high tech clothing which can monitor health status and give feedback to the individual. I was impressed with his vision for the future.

A few days after the Walt USA ribbon cutting, another ground breaking event in North Logan also occurred at the Innovation Campus. INOVAR is an Electronic Manufacturing Service provider in the Rocky Mountain Region. They provide high tech services to the military, aerospace, medical communications and industrial markets. Their 120,000 square foot facility will bring many high quality jobs to the North Logan area.

We welcome these innovative and visionary companies to our city.

STREETS & STORMWATER

We are asking the residents of North Logan to please **not** place piles of topsoil, mulch, woodchips, gravel, dirt, tree limbs, or landscaping materials of any kind in the **curb** or **roadway**. A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.

CULINARY WATER NOTICE:

We are implementing phase 2 - the yellow level - Moderate drought, from our Water Shortage Management Policies and Procedures Plan.

Target: Water Use Reduction:
A city wide reduction of water usage of 15-20%.

Reduction Strategies:

- Water users must cut back exterior watering by 15% (i.e. users shall water no more than three days per week).
- Commercial, Industrial, and Research Buildings cut back by 15% on all water usage (both inside/outside usage).
- No washing of cars using culinary water at a home/residence.
- No spraying sidewalks, driveways..etc. with a hose.
- No excessive or wasteful watering.
- City's splash pad will be reduced to 6 hours/day.

The City may also monitor water usage through real time water meter reports. If a resident, commercial, industrial, or research related water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement standards.

Mosquitoes must have water in which to lay their eggs and develop into adults.

If you get rid of places with standing water, there will be fewer mosquitoes around your home.

The following is a list of mosquito breeding areas around the home that may be eliminated. Please check these sites:

- Tires/Ruts/Cans/Buckets/Glass Jars
- Wading or Ornamental Pools
- Water Troughs/Catch Basins
- Clogged rain gutters
- Discarded drinking cups
- Street gutters
- Irrigation ditches
- Broken lawn sprinklers
- Depressions in yard

A small amount of rain water in the bottom of a discarded can may produce many biting adult mosquitoes.

PUBLIC SAFETY CONTINUED...

Protect yourself from mosquitoes:

Clothing: Wear long sleeved shirts and long pants when around active mosquito areas

Dawn/Dusk: Avoid going outdoors if possible because mosquitoes are most active during this time of day

Repellent: Apply insect repellent such as DEET, Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus, etc.

Screens: Install or repair tight-fitting window and door screens to keep mosquitoes

Shrubs: Trim and thin shrubs and bushy plants where mosquitoes tend to stay

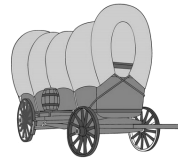
NORTH LOGAN 'ROCKIN'

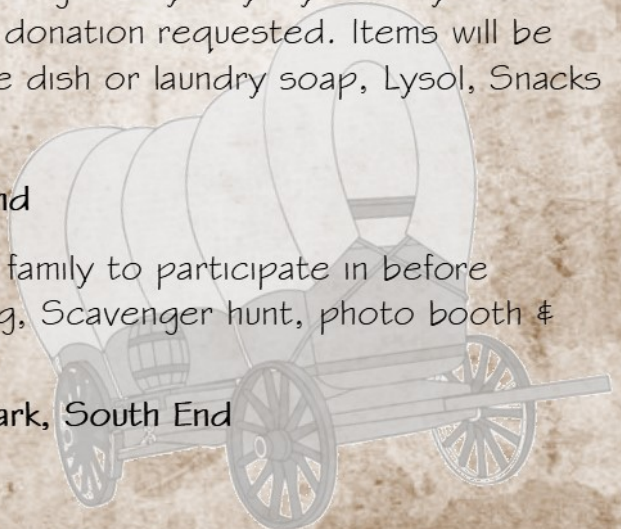

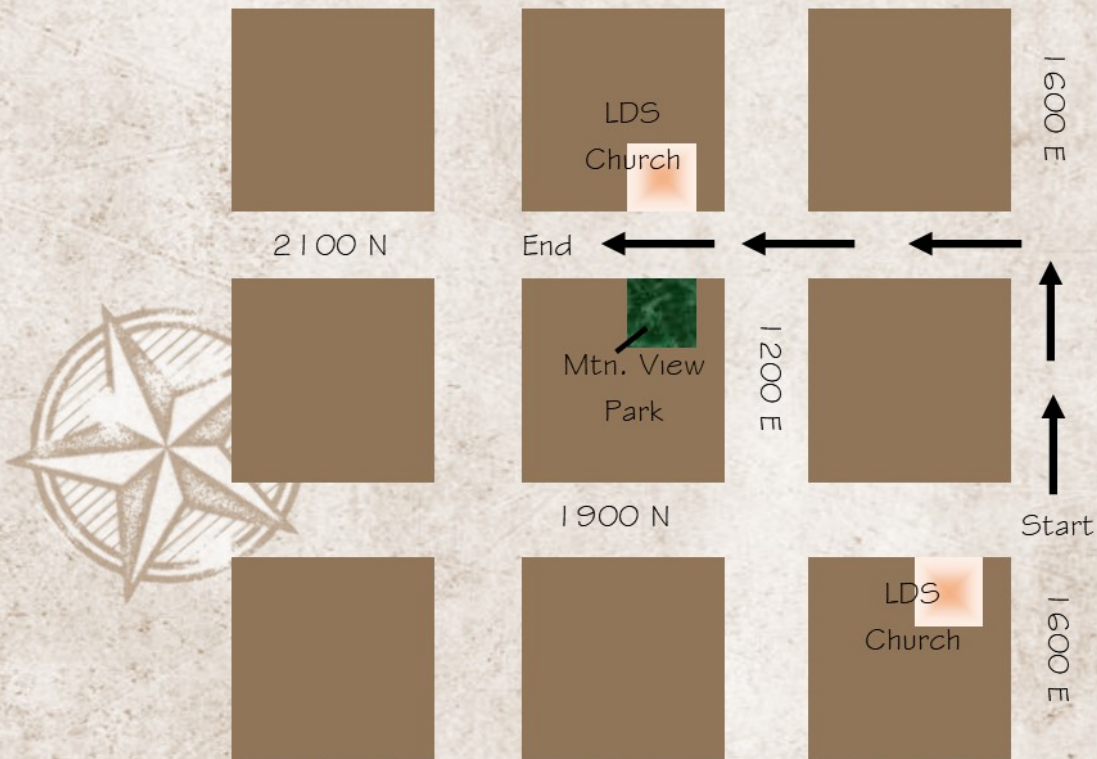
