GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings this month will take place on Wednesdays, February 1st & 15th, at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. In February, the City Council will discuss potential changes to the Park Reservation policies and some updates to the Employee Handbook. In addition, the second meeting in February will include departmental FY2024 budget proposals for the Community Development, Building Inspection, Fire, and Economic Development Departments.

The Planning Commission meetings this month will take place on Thursdays, February 2nd & 16th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public hearings or work session discussions on the following topics: ♦A proposal to adjust regulations associated with "Small Multi-Unit Storage", "Large Warehouse-Type Storage", and "Solid Waste Facilities"; ♦A proposal to adjust the subdivision and development standards in the RE-5 zone; ♦A potential amendment to the existing Design Review process for commercial, industrial, institutional, and city-center developments; ♦Consideration of an application for a conditional use permit for a detached accessory dwelling unit located at 3270 N 1875 E. Additional items may be discussed in February, depending on applications received throughout the month.

To stay informed on planning topics in the City, all Planning Comm. & City Council agendas are published at least 24 hours in advance of any scheduled meetings on the Utah Public Notice website (utah.gov). Feel free to create an account on the utah.gov site and follow the North Logan City Council or Planning Commission to receive notifications of upcoming meetings. We also post our agendas on our website and on the North Logan City Facebook & Instagram pages prior to the meetings. NORTH PARK POLICE

From time to time, I have the opportunity to talk with citizens who either walk into our office or reach out by phone. Over the last several weeks, I have fielded several questions regarding roundabouts and how to use them properly. A traffic roundabout is a circular intersection. Its simple design is intended to keep traffic flowing smoothly, quickly, and more efficiently than traditional 4-leg intersections.

As with every intersection, there are rules governing its safe use. The following reminders were taken out of the Utah Drivers Handbook 2022-2023 edition. As a reminder:

1. Vehicles travel counterclockwise around a raised center island.
2. Entering traffic yields the right-of-way to traffic approaching from the left.
3. When entering a roundabout, motorist should slow down before entering the circle.
4. Yield to the traffic and pedestrians in the circle.
5. Enter the roundabout when there is a safe gap in traffic.
6. Signal your exit for two seconds.
7. Once you enter a roundabout, do not stop.
8. This sign warns you that there is a traffic circle ahead.



DOG LICENSE RENEWAL

Please remember that all dogs living in North Logan must be licensed. Licenses are due on the anniversary date of the rabies vaccination (i.e., your dog's City license expires on the same date that their rabies certificate expires). The cost is \$15 for spayed or neutered dogs, or \$25 for unaltered. If your dog is



no longer with you, or if you have questions about when your dog's license is due, please call the City Office, at 435-752-1310 ext 1. Thank you!!

STREETS

Into February, our Streets Department will be continuing to inspect and trim trees that are encroaching into the roadway. Our city ordinance has a standard of 12 feet over the back of curbs and 7 feet over sidewalks. Any branches that violate this clearance space are subject to removal by our crews. If any citizen prefers to do this themselves or hire someone else, that is acceptable. However, our Streets Department will be working to clear the encroaching branches and will not wait for property owners to complete this task.

Also, snow removal is to be expected during the month of February. Please comply with the winter parking ordinance and give our snowplow drivers a break by taking the time to park your car off the roadway during the night.

Additionally, when clearing the snow from your driveways, please remember that **it is against the law** to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers. Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, children trying to pass on their way to school, and neighbors walking or exercising.



It is also helpful to remove any material/personal property from the roadway.

FLIP THE STRIP

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. Water utility bill credits will be available for participants. Please, watch the city's website northlogancity.org and social media for details in the coming months. Initially, this will be for commercial only, with residential to follow later.

SEWER

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter WATER usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your Winter Average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.

STORMWATER

This winter, we have more snow than the previous couple of years. Rain storms have been mixed in as well. This can be a troublesome combination as the piled snow from trucks can block gutters and storm drains. The rainwater then has no place to go. If such situations are happening near you and causing flooding, please call the city office, and crews will come to solve the issue. We are watching for these situations, as well.

A couple of reminders:

1. Don't overuse ice melt as it runs into the storm drains as pollutant.
2. Keep snow on your property.

APPRECIATION FOR MAYOR LYNSDAY PETERSON

In Mayor Lyndsay Peterson's first year of office, she has secured property and bonds for our future water system; received a \$3M loan and \$1M grant for sewer; secured \$2.9M in grants for roads; \$4.5M in donations for a new city office; and \$6.1M in endowment funding for a new community center (and counting). All of which has helped keep North Logan City's property tax rate below the average in Cache Valley. In addition, she has increased communication and transparency with the residents of the community; and made significant improvements to the Library and Recreation Departments, who now set the standard in Cache Valley for the number of annual participants. She has worked with the Police Department to increase the standard of service; and, this past week, she helped remove 683 parcels in North Logan City from the Hyde Park Cemetery Maintenance District Tax.

Additionally, this year, when Logan City decided to no longer provide garbage collection services for the other cities of Cache Valley; Mayor Peterson spent countless hours working with the other Mayors of the County to secure garbage collection services.

WATER

Water Meter Damage



Our Water Department has started to upgrade our water meters to a new Master Meter Allegro meter. Some of you may have noticed a different-looking lid on your meter pit. It has a round black antenna in the middle of it. The antenna is connected to the water meter with a cable to boost the radio signal with the read from the meter. Removing the lid may damage the expensive electronics of the meter. The cost of repairing any damage caused may be at the customer's expense.
