STORMWATER

Benefits of On-site Use

On-site retention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention, or detention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property. Controlling and reducing the amount of runoff from a site can reduce the risk of flooding as well as reduce the size and extent of drainage infrastructure. The use of vegetation in sustainable storm water management practices provides substantial benefits for water quality and quantity. Vegetation intercepts rainfall, reducing the erosivity of raindrops. Vegetation increases surface friction, slowing runoff and promoting settling of suspended solids. Root systems increase pore space and promote infiltration of storm water, and the roots themselves help to anchor soil, protecting against rill and gully formation from concentrated flows. Vegetation can also help to remove pollutants from storm water through biological uptake of nutrients.

STREETS



We would like to remind everyone that the winter parking ordinance (11-604) is still in effect. This means dumpsters, porta potties, vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., **cannot** be parked on city streets, curbs and shoulders between **1:00 am - 5:00 am** on any day. Please let your family and friends know, as well as your renters if you have them, as citations will be issued during these hours. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep the roads clean and safe for you and your family.

Did You Know it's against City Ordinance to push snow into the road? When clearing your driveways and sidewalks, **DO NOT** push snow or snow-blow into the road. Doing this can cause dangerous bumps which can turn to ice, causing accidents, injuries and property damage for citizens and snow plow operators. Please do your part to keep the roadways clear by pushing snow into your yard instead of the road. Thank you!

PUBLIC SAFETY

As we find ourselves in this unusually dry winter season I wanted to remind home owners of the responsibility they have of removing any potential snow from sidewalks. This helps with pedestrian travel, especially children walking to and from school. The North Logan City ordinance reads:

11-309 Removal Of Snow



A. It shall be unlawful for the owner, occupant, lessor, or agent of any property, abutting on a paved sidewalk to fail to remove, or have removed from such paved sidewalk, all hail, snow, or sleet thereon within a reasonable time after such snow, hail, or sleet has fallen. In the case of a storm between the hours of 5 p.m. and 6 a.m. such sidewalks shall be cleaned before 9 a.m. of the same day.

It shall be unlawful for any person removing snow from the sidewalk, to deposit snow, dirt, leaves, or any other material in the gutter so as to clog or prevent the free flow of water therein.

Please help keep your neighbors and school children safe by keeping your sidewalks clear from snow. Please also keep fire hydrants clear of snow or any other debris within a 3 foot radius. A few minutes of digging out a **fire hydrant** may make the difference between minor damage or a complete disaster for you or your neighbor if a fire occurs.

EMERGENCY PREP

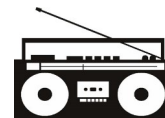


Will we be able to contact you in an Emergency??

HEAT PROGRAM

The HEAT Program is a federally funded assistance program designed to help low-income, elderly and disabled households with home energy costs.

The HEAT program is open Nov 1 through April 30th or until federal funds are exhausted.

Eligibility and benefit amounts are determined by number of U.S. residents or permanent residents in the household, household income, household size and energy costs (fuel and electric bills). Household must be under 150% of the Federal Poverty Level.

HEAT benefits are a **one-time a year payment** and will not cover your entire winter heating costs.

The HEAT Program is located in the BRAG Offices at 170 N Main in Logan.

NL YOUTH COUNCIL

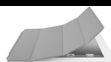
