MAYOR'S MESSAGE

The city of North Logan is a growing community with many opportunities. We now have a high school in our town and many other attractions. Along with this comes the need for more infrastructure and more planning for the future. In North Logan we have long had a master roads plan, as land owners have developed land along these roadways, the City has been able to use impact fees, along with County funds to aid in the road construction costs and help provide needed connectivity. Unfortunately, development has not provided all the needed roads.

Connectivity to the East Bench has often been discussed by the City Council. The issues are especially apparent where much of the traffic must go North to 3100 North and then back South and to the West. Traffic often finds its way to the intersection of 2500 North and 800 East causing significant congestion at peak times of the day as well as difficulty for the school children needing to cross at the intersection. For many years we have looked forward to 2300 North or other East to West connections. The developments to complete these roads have not come.

As a city council we have discussed these issues many times and considered how to best fund new roads and which roads would be the most effective. This year Hyde Park and North Logan have applied together for funding from the CMPO (Cache Metropolitan Planning Organization) to connect 3100 North from 1600 East to 400 East which would provide a direct connection to the Highway. We are pleased to announce that this funding for 3100N was approved. When this project is completed we should see reduced demand on other East to West roads. Along with this, improvement needs to be done to some of the intersections on 800 East, especially 2500 North. My highest priority in this, is to keep pedestrians as well as vehicular traffic safe as they travel through North Logan City.

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS

City Council

The City Council will meet on Wednesday, November 7th and November 21st (potentially) at 6:30pm. The City Council meetings are held in the Council Meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the month of November the City Council will be considering ordinances dealing with park strip maintenance, and other updates to the zoning matrix.

There will also be discussions regarding a proposed concept plan for a subdivision located at approximately 1100E 1800N, along with a concept plan for a subdivision at 1400E 2850N.

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission will meet on Thursday, November 8th at 6:30pm. The Planning Commission meetings are held in the Council Meeting room at the North Logan Library.

The Planning Commission will be discussing rural road design standards, potential zoning changes along 2500N (west of 100W), along with additional zoning matrix updates. There will most likely be a subdivision proposal for a concept plan in the Industrial Zone at approximately 400W 2800N.

The Planning Commission will also continue their discussion of the General Plan, along with reports and updates from the neighborhood districts throughout the community. The Planning Commission is constantly seeking more involvement and input from members of the community in the discussions of the City's General Plan and how it will shape the future land use, quality of life, and identity of North Logan City. If you would like to be involved, please contact your district representative, and attend the Planning Commission meetings.

UTILITIES

If you have a sprinkler system connected to the City water line, it's that time of the year to drain your system and blow out your lines to protect from freezing. When you turn off your sprinkler system, please make SURE IT IS TURNED OFF ALL THE WAY. If left on even a quarter of a turn, water can leak out your stop and waste valve all winter long.

STREETS



No Early AM Parking on Streets after Nov. 15th!

We would like to remind everyone that starting **November 15th**, the winter parking ordinance (11-604) will go into effect. This means vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., cannot be parked on city streets, curbs and shoulders between **1:00 am - 5:00 am** on any day. Please let your family and friends know, as well as your renters if you have them, as citations will be issued during these hours. Do not put your garbage/recycling out the night before if it looks like there will be snow during the night. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep your roads clean and safe for you and your family. STORMWATER

- Regularly clean/sweep parking lots to prevent debris run-off
- Inspect & clean inlets and catch basins of any debris
- Install oil/water separators, chemical separators, snouts, or other appropriate filtration devices
- Limit the amount of pesticides and herbicides applied to lawn, park strips, and landscaped areas
- Eliminate excessive use of fertilizers to landscaping. Sweep up excess fertilizer rather than hosing it away
- Verify that wash bay facilities are draining to sanitary sewer and not to storm drains
- Minimize the use of de-icing salts or use alternate methods for snow removal

STORMWATER CONT'D

- Cover loaded trucks to prevent items from blowing out and entering storm drain systems
- Cover trash containers to prevent garbage migration via wind and/or animals to storm water system
- Regularly inspect and maintain vehicles to make sure no fluids are leaking that would pollute storm drain systems

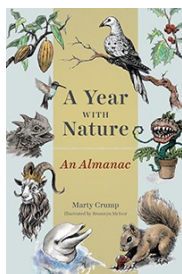

ANNUAL CEMETERY FLOWER & DECORATION REMOVAL

On Nov. 26nd the City will discard all decorations and flowers from the Cemetery that appear out of condition or are not in compliance with the City's Cemetery Ordinance, including shepherds hooks. This cleaning takes place semi-annually after Memorial Day and Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance please go to the City website, www.northlogancity.org.

"Glass containers are prohibited...small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, flowers, decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain **within the 6" concrete base** (mowing strip) on the **north and/or south** of the headstone/monument. Shepherds hooks, pinwheels, etc. are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone, mowing strip. All decorations, vases, toys, et., are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed."
