MAYOR'S MESSAGE

North Logan City's Mayor John Bailey will be taking a leave of absence due to the relapse of a bone marrow cancer he had fifteen years ago. Damon Cann, a member of the North Logan City Council was appointed as the acting mayor during the May 16th City Council meeting. This decision came after much consideration and unanimous agreement of the City Council and Mayor Bailey. Damon Cann, as Mayor Pro Tem, will work closely with the other members of the City Council to fulfill the responsibilities left in Mayor Bailey's absence.

The length of Mayor Bailey's leave is still to be determined at this time. We ask that the privacy of Mayor Bailey and his family be respected.

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS

City Council

The City Council will meet on Wednesday, June 6th and June 20th at 6:30pm. The City Council meetings are held in the Council Meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the month of June the City Council will be considering and adopting revisions to the budget for the current fiscal year which ends on June 30th, and adopting the proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal year which begins July 1st. These budget considerations will contain a discussion of revenue sources and funds, along with expenses related to the general fund, enterprise accounts, and the RDA. There will also be a public hearing to discuss the proposed sewer rate increases, which are needed to fund the new mechanical wastewater treatment plant that will be constructed in Logan.

The City Council will also be discussing a few subdivisions proposals. The subdivisions that will be under consideration will be proposed in the City Center Zones along 400E, and along Wolf Pack Way. For more information on these subdivisions please contact the City's Community Development Department.

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission will meet on Thursday, June 7th and June 21st, at 6:30pm. The Planning Commission meetings are held in the Council Meeting room at the North Logan Library.

There will be a discussion and consideration of a concept plan for a large subdivision located at approximately 2850N 1500E in the Residential Estate RE-1 Zone.

One additional development will be proposed at approximately 2200N 600E related to nursing care. This will require a discussion of zoning and permitted uses.

The Planning Commission will also continue their discussion of the General Plan, along with reports and updates from the neighborhood districts throughout the community. The Planning Commission is constantly seeking more involvement and input from members of the community in the discussions of the City's General Plan and how it will shape the future land use, quality of life, and identity of North Logan City. If you would like to be involved, please contact your district representative, and attend the Planning Commission meetings.

UTILITIES

If the green waste drop site roll-off is full please do not place the materials on the ground surrounding the dumpster. CULINARY WATER NOTICE

We are implementing phase 2 - the yellow level - Moderate drought, from our Water Shortage Management Policies and Procedures Plan.

TARGET: Water Use Reduction: A city wide reduction of water usage of 15-20%.

REDUCTION STRATEGIES:

- Water users must cut back exterior watering by 15% (ie. users shall water no more than three days per week).
- Commercial, Industrial, and Research Buildings cut back by 15% on all water usage (both inside/outside usage).
- No washing of cars using culinary water at a home/residence.
- No spraying sidewalks, driveways, etc. with a hose.
- No excessive or wasteful watering. (I.E. watering during a rain-storm)
- City's splash pads will be reduced to 6 hours/day.

The City may also monitor water usage through real time water meter reports. If a resident, commercial, industrial, or research related water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement standards. Please visit our website for more information.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT



The Cache Mosquito Abatement District invites North Logan residents to visit their website: cachemosquito.com. This website provides useful information as to their mosquito control process, along with a detailed Home and Garden Maintenance Checklist. The district reminds us that standing water is the mosquito nursery. Mosquitoes can hatch in a week or less, in as little as a half-inch of water. If you get rid of still or stagnant water at least weekly, you will keep many mosquitoes from breeding and take a big step toward protecting yourself and your family. Many other useful tips are also found on the checklist.
