MAYOR'S MESSAGE

North Logan is a great place to live, and I am grateful for the opportunity to serve our city as a council member. In working with our city staff and the other elected representatives and appointed officials, I appreciate the quality of people serving in these positions and concern shared by all for the well-being of our city and the quality of life for our citizens. To preserve and progress these objectives, it is important that we have good open lines of communication with citizens.

One of the ways that citizens communicate with the city council and planning commission is through public hearings. While this format is an effective way for citizens to voice comments and concerns for the city to hear, it does not allow for dialog between representatives and citizens. The rules given before the public comment state that if dialog is desired that the citizens should talk with the commission members or the council before the public hearing. If I heard this for the first time on an issue that was important to me, I would likely be disappointed and maybe frustrated that my city officials would not answer my question during the hearing.

As representatives of the city, we are interested in hearing from and working with the citizens to work through concerns as they may arise. I would encourage visits or dialog with officials and representatives before public hearings whenever possible to allow us to be able to talk more specifically with you about your concerns. This can be done through e-mail or by making an appointment for a visit. The city also is adding a section to the website to allow for easier comment from citizens.

Our desire is to have a good understanding of the citizens wants and needs and help citizens understand the whats, hows, and whys of decisions that are made by the council and planning commission. Good open communication is key, and we welcome your thoughts and comments.

The Planning Commission will be discussing street tree regulations and requirements, rural road design standards, along with additional zoning matrix updates.

The Planning Commission will also continue their discussion of the General Plan, along with reports and updates from the neighborhood districts throughout the community. The Planning Commission is constantly seeking more involvement and input from members of the community in the discussions of the City's General Plan and how it will shape the future land use, quality of life, and identity of North Logan City. STORMWATER

Benefits of On-site Storm Water

On-site retention, or detention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property. Controlling and reducing the amount of runoff from a site can reduce the risk of flooding as well as reduce the size and extent of drainage infrastructure. The use of vegetation in sustainable storm water management practices provides substantial benefits for water quality and quantity. Vegetation intercepts rainfall, reducing the erosivity of raindrops. Vegetation increases surface friction, slowing runoff and promoting settling of suspended solids. Root systems increase pore space and promote infiltration of storm water, and the roots themselves help to anchor soil, protecting against rill and gully formation from concentrated flows. Vegetation can also help to remove pollutants from storm water through biological uptake of nutrients.

CULINARY WATER NOTICE

We are implementing phase 2 - the yellow level - Moderate drought, from our Water Shortage Management Policies and Procedures Plan.

Target: Water Use Reduction: A city wide reduction of water usage of 15-20%.

Reduction Strategies:

- Water users must cut back exterior watering by 15% (i.e. users shall water no more than three days per week).
- Commercial, Industrial, and Research Buildings cut back by 15% on all water usage (both inside/outside usage).
- No washing of cars using culinary water at a residence.
- No spraying sidewalks, driveways...etc. with a hose.
- No excessive/wasteful watering.
- Splash pad will be reduced to 6 hours/day.

The City may also monitor water usage through real time water meter reports. If a resident, commercial, industrial, or research related water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement Standards.

NORTH PARK POLICE DEPT

As the summer starts to come to a close it signals that the start of school is just around the corner, August 22nd to be exact. Between North Logan and Hyde Park there are 6 schools. That means lots of our youth using crosswalks going and coming from school. Although students should use designated crosswalks we know that is not always the case and they can appear from anywhere. North Park Police ask that you be mindful of the increase in foot traffic. Slow down, put down the cell phone and drive alert. Speaking of crosswalks, North Park Police is in need of people willing to serve as crosswalk guards. It's a great way to help support your community and you can get paid while doing it! MOSQUITO ABATEMENT

The Cache Mosquito Abatement District (CMAD) invites North Logan residents to visit their website: cachemosquito.com. This website provides useful information as to their mosquito control process, along with a detailed Home and Garden Maintenance Checklist. Many other useful tips are also found on the checklist.

The CMAD seeks to reduce the risk of mosquito-borne illness, especially West Nile Virus. The first line of defense is to reduce breeding through prevention. Drain standing water in the form of clogged gutters, children's toys, pet water dishes and birdbaths. It only takes half a cup of water to provide a breeding area for mosquitoes. Empty pet dishes and bird baths a couple times a week to get rid of any eggs or larva.

The second line is the use of larvicide. Several of the compounds used by CMAD target only mosquito larva and do not harm other water-based organisms, mammals, or the environment. FIRE BLIGHT

This past spring brought with it the perfect conditions for a disease called fire blight. Fire blight is a very common bacterial disease that affects apples, crabapples and pears. It can be very destructive, especially if we experience warm weather (60-70 degrees) and a rain event during full bloom, as we did this past spring.

Symptoms:

Fire blight can be easily identified by its unique symptoms. An infected tree's leaves and branches will shrivel and turn brown or black, giving it a scorched appearance, hence the name. The flower clusters on the tree will also shrivel and turn brown or black.
