

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

With the coming of winter, I'd just like to share a few brief thoughts. First, as the weather turns cold, we start to think about indoor rather than outdoor recreation activities. North Logan offers a number of recreation programs that continue through the winter, including our Green Canyon Wolves basketball program as well as a number of programs taking advantage of our shared use agreement with the new RSL facility and Green Canyon High School. The North Logan Library continues to run some fun programs (as well as great books) that provide some enjoyable opportunities through the winter.

Second, as winter comes, we think a lot about outdoor air quality, but we also need to remember indoor air quality. Many areas in northern Utah are at risk for elevated radon levels. If you haven't checked radon levels in your home, I would invite you to do so--after smoking, radon is one of the highest risk factors for developing lung cancer.

Third, we are experimenting with a new newsletter format that is a little more compact (and somewhat less expensive). Please reach out to me or others in the city to let us know how you like this newsletter format--do you prefer a longer newsletter with more detail, or is it better to keep it brief so it is easier to read more of the information quickly? Your feedback will help us to know how to best use this space to communicate.

WATER**Culinary Water:**

If you have a sprinkler system connected to the City line, it's time to drain your system and blow out your lines to protect from freezing. Please make **SURE IT IS TURNED OFF ALL THE WAY**. If left on even a quarter of a turn, water can leak out your stop and waste valve all winter long.

STORMWATER

- Clean/sweep parking lots to prevent debris run-off.
- Inspect & clean inlets and catch basins of any debris.
- Install oil/water separators, chemical separators, snouts, or other appropriate filtration devices.
- Limit the amount of pesticides/herbicides applied to lawn, park strips, and landscaped areas.
- Eliminate excessive use of fertilizers.
- Sweep up excess fertilizer.
- Verify that wash bay facilities drain to sanitary sewer.
- Minimize de-icing salts or use alternate methods.
