GOVERNMENT MEETINGS

City Council

The City Council will meet on Wednesday, August 1st and August 15th at 6:30pm. The City Council meetings are held in the Council Meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the month of June the City Council will be considering the development plan for the Heritage Subdivision (senior only) on the property located at approximately 2400N 300E. The City Council will also be considering a minor commercial subdivision located at 2400N Wolf Pack Way.

There will be a public hearing in August regarding the proposed 2.2% property tax increase. With this proposed increase, the average resident would see a \$0.53/month increase in property taxes.

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission will meet on Thursday, August 2nd and August 16th, at 6:30pm. The Planning Commission meetings are held in the Council Meeting room at the North Logan Library.

The Planning Commission will be discussing a number of potential code changes. These code changes will focus on permitted and conditional uses throughout the City. There will be a discussion of park strip maintenance and street tree regulations and requirements, along with an update of City Center Code requirements for the Hospital Zone.

The Planning Commission will also continue their discussion of the General Plan, along with reports and updates from the neighborhood districts throughout the community. The Planning Commission is constantly seeking more involvement and input from members of the community in the discussions of the City's General Plan and how it will shape the future land use, quality of life, and identity of North Logan City. If you would like to be involved, please contact your district representative, and attend the Planning Commission meetings.

MISCELLANEOUS

SECONDARY WATER USERS

Initiated July 23, 2018.

First, it is requested that those of our group with CANAL SHARES use their water between the hours of 6:00 pm and 6:00 am and to cut back their use where possible as instructed by the canal company.

Two nearly equal groups have been identified based on the number of shares in Green Canyon Sprinkler Company and we ask that you follow the listed schedule, at least for now.

GROUP 1: Those with last names starting with Adams through Keifer will use the water between the hours of 6am and 6pm on Monday and Thursday.

GROUP 2: Those with the last names starting with King through Wilson will use the water between the hours of 6am and 6pm on Tuesday and Friday.

We are asked to conserve as much as possible to please do your share.

Needless to say, there may be additional changes as our dry summer continues and we appreciate your help in meeting the current restrictions from the canal company.

STORMWATER

We are asking the residents of North Logan to please **not** place piles of topsoil, mulch, woodchips, gravel, dirt, tree limbs, or landscaping materials of any kind in the **curb** or **roadway**. A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.

CULINARY WATER NOTICE

We are implementing phase 2 - the yellow level - Moderate drought, from our Water Shortage Management Policies and Procedures Plan.

Target: Water Use Reduction: A city wide reduction of water usage of 15-20%.

Reduction Strategies:

- Water users must cut back exterior watering by 15% (i.e. users shall water no more than three days per week).

CULINARY WATER CONTD...

- Commercial, Industrial, and Research Buildings cut back by 15% on all water usage (both inside/outside usage).
- No washing of cars using culinary water at a residence.
- No spraying sidewalks, driveways..etc. with a hose.
- No excessive/wasteful watering.
- Splash pad will be reduced to 6 hours/day.

The City may also monitor water usage through real time water meter reports. If a resident, commercial, industrial, or research related water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement Standards.

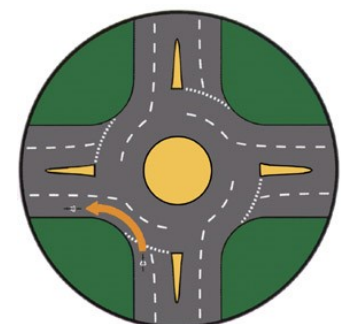

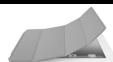
