MAYOR'S MESSAGE

As you all know, our city has been considering the best direction for us to move in connection with our police services. At our last city council meeting the city council endorsed the following statement, and in the event that citizens may not have seen it in the news, I would like to share it with you all here:

Over the last several months, North Logan City's elected officials have been assessing the best way to provide the best police services to the city in a cost-effective manner that our citizens expect. We believe it is the responsibility of elected officials to evaluate and re-evaluate the services the city provides to be sure we are efficiently providing top-notch services to our citizens, and we will continue to do so on an on-going basis.

We have solicited and received a significant amount of feedback through meetings, conversations, and e-mails. We appreciate the way citizens of our community have come forward to share their opinions on these issues. These dialogues help us make the best decisions we can for our community.

At this time, we believe the right course of action is to move forward as a participant in the North Park Police Agency. Consistent with feedback we have received from our citizens, we will work with them to provide the highest quality services possible while pursuing citizens' direction for fiscal responsibility and accountability. We will also encourage the North Park Police Commission to investigate whether there are efficiencies to be gained by partnering with Smithfield.

We wish to underscore our appreciation for our law enforcement officers who take on a difficult task every day when they go to work. Their service is truly appreciated. We also thank Sheriff Jensen and his willingness to engage with us when we approached him with questions.



In addition to this message, I'd like to add a message of thanks to Chief Kim Hawkes, our chief of police for over two decades. I've learned a great deal about police work from him, and as he retired at the end of the June, I want to express appreciation for the many good things he has done for our community. By the time this newsletter reaches your hands, we expect to have an interim chief in place who will work with our police force. Best wishes to you all for a happy and safe summer!

TAX AND FEE INCREASES

Property Taxes: North Logan City hasn't increased property taxes in roughly 20 years. This coming year the average resident will see a 2.2% property tax increase to aid in the balancing of the municipal budget. The average resident will see a \$0.53/month increase in property taxes from North Logan City.

Sewer Rate Increase: As indicated this past year, the EPA has mandated new requirements for discharge to the Little Bear River from the existing sewage treatment lagoons in Logan. As such Logan City is required to install a new 115 million dollar mechanical treatment plant. Because North Logan City discharges its sewage to the Logan Treatment Plant, we are required to participate in the associated construction costs. Beginning August 1st, the average North Logan City resident will see an additional \$6/month increase in monthly sewer fees to help pay our portion of the new mechanical waste water treatment plant.

Garbage Fee Increases: Logan City Environmental Department has recently adopted a ~ \$2/month increase in garbage rates. This rate has been passed on to the participating cities, including North Logan City.

MISCELLANEOUS

UTILITIES

Please make sure your water meter lid is uncovered and free from any of the following, railroad ties, flower boxes, sprinkler boxes, dirt, grass or any obstacle. Trim back bushes and plants around the meter. Our meter readers are trying to get an accurate reading, and they are also looking for any problems in the meter barrel.

Also, just a reminder, please **don't open the water meter lids** to check your reading or turn off your water. There are radios and wires that can easily be broken. If broken you will be fined in excess of \$100. If you need your water service turned off, please contact us at 752-1310 ext. 11 or 10.

Water Contamination Prevention..

Utah Public Drinking Water Rules allows the use of dual source systems under the conditions: A sprinkling system utilizing non-potable pressurized irrigation and the public drinking water system may have a "swing connection" installed so that EITHER the pressurized irrigation OR the drinking water system is feeding the sprinkling system (only one supply can be connected at any one time), AND a Reduced Pressure Zone Principal backflow assembly (RP) must be installed on the drinking water system to protect that system from any residual contamination from the irrigation water on the sprinkling water system from entering the drinking water system. Reduced Pressure Zone Principal backflow assemblies must be tested by a certified backflow technician with ten (10) days of initial use and annually thereafter. Test reports must be forwarded to North Logan City.

NORTH PARK POLICE DEPT

We are approaching the two holidays in Utah most noted for celebrating with fireworks. This year, the state legislature adjusted the times and days that fireworks can legally

be set off. For your information the law now reads:

53-7-225. Times for sale and discharge of fireworks

- 1) Except as provided in Section 53-7-221, this section supersedes any other code provision regarding the sale or discharge of fireworks.
- 2) A person may sell class C common state approved explosives in the state as follows:
 - a) beginning June 24 and ending July 25;
 - b) beginning Dec 29 and ending Dec 31;
 - c) two days before and on the Chinese New Year's eve.
- 3) A person may discharge class C common state approved explosives in the state except as follows:
 - a) between the hours of 11 am and 11 pm, except that on July 4 and July 24, the hours are 11 am to midnight:
 - i) beginning July 2 and ending July 5;
 - ii) beginning July 22 and ending July 25;
 - iii) beginning at 11 am Dec 31 and ending at 1 am on the following day; or
 - iv) if New Year's eve is on a Sunday and the county, municipality, or metro township determines to celebrate New Year's eve on the prior Saturday, then a person may discharge class C common state approved explosives on that prior Saturday within the county, municipality, or metro township; and
 - b) beginning at 11 am on the Chinese New Year's eve and ending at 1 am on the following day.

Please use extreme caution when lighting off fireworks. Always have adult supervision when celebrating with fireworks. Use only fireworks purchased in Utah to assure that they are legal to use in the state. Have a fun and safe summer.

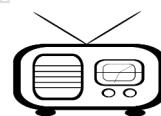

PUMPKIN WALK

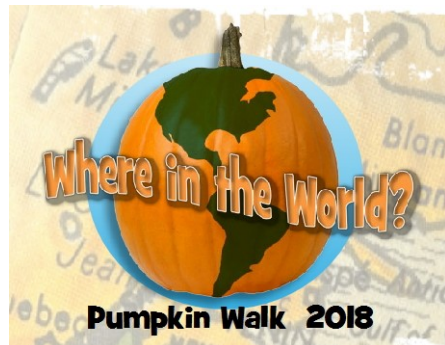
