MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Summer brings so much excitement in North Logan! We are looking forward to our 24th of July celebration this summer. This year's celebrations will continue traditions that we have loved for so long, including our parade, games at the park, and evening events with fireworks. It's a great opportunity to bring out your family and visit with friends as we celebrate together.

This summer you will notice some road work in North Logan. We have increased our use of crack seal and chip seal treatments of our roads. These surface treatments extend the life of our roads substantially and are a fraction of the cost of replacing the roads. This proverbial ounce of prevention avoids a very costly pound of cure later on.

Speaking of construction, we have just broken ground for a new roundabout at 2200 North 400 East, paid for through an Air Quality Grant specific to this intersection. Roundabouts are proven to diminish the number and severity of accidents at intersections while also reducing congestion. We encourage our residents to watch an online video (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=35XgSJ-nSdo>) from Red Deer that illustrates safe roundabout use for vehicles and pedestrians. We'll also post a link to the video at northlogancity.org. If you don't have internet access at home but would like to view the video, come in to the North Logan Library to use one of our free public access computers. While you are there, you can pick up a book or participate in some of the summer reading activities.

Finally, with kids going outside for summer adventures, please talk to your young people about respecting neighbors and avoiding trespassing. The vast majority of our young people are doing the right thing, but we've had a few incidents that we do not want to see become habits. Let's all remember to be respectful of others.

CULINARY WATER NOTICE

Why are we in **Yellow** with all of the moisture we have received?

The added moisture from the winter and rain-filled spring is helping our wells and water supply. The reason we are in **Yellow** conservation mode is due to the distribution system. We are limited by what we are able to clean and supply to residents. As irrigation systems run, the demand on the system grows rapidly. With the demand, we place restrictions on outdoor use in order to slow down the demand. The moisture this winter and spring will help us continue to provide water through the year.

We are implementing phase 2 - **Yellow Level** - Moderate drought, from our Water Shortage Management Plan.

TARGET: Water Use Reduction: A city wide reduction of water usage of 15-20%.
REDUCTION STRATEGIES:

- Water users must cut back exterior watering (users shall water no more than 3 days per week).
- Commercial, Industrial, & Research Buildings cut back on all in/outside usage.
- No washing of cars at residences.
- No spraying sidewalks, driveways.
- No excessive/wasteful watering (watering during a rainstorm)

We will also monitor water usage through real time water reports. If a North Logan water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement standards. Full details at www.northlogancity.org.

A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.
