Recently, North Logan City Council has been evaluating some of the canal trails and trying to understand the public's rights on these trails. Many of these trails have recently been gated and posted. How these trails have historically been used has a legal impact on what the public's rights are. We are seeking historical information on the use of these trails and ask those with information to please submit it to Spencer Burt, our Community Development Director ([Spencer@northlogancity.org](mailto:Spencer@northlogancity.org)). This information could include pictures or a statement of how you have used these trails and during what time period you used them. We hope this information will help guide us as we work to understand the rights of the public as well as the rights of property owners along these trails.

## NORTH PARK POLICE

**Winter parking** restrictions are in effect. Please be sure to have your **vehicles off the streets** so the plow drivers can keep the roads clear of snow this winter. North Park Police officers will be issuing citations if you are in violation of the following code:

### 11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking Prohibited

No person shall park a vehicle on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) a.m. and five o'clock (5:00) a.m. of any day, **beginning November 15 and ending the last day of February of each year**, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.

## STORMWATER

- Clean/sweep parking lots to prevent debris run-off.
- Inspect & clean inlets and catch basins of any debris.
- Install oil/water separators, chemical separators, snouts, or other appropriate filtration devices.
- Limit the amount of pesticides/herbicides applied to lawn, park strips, and landscaped areas.
- Eliminate excessive use of fertilizers.
- Sweep up excess fertilizer.
- Verify that wash bay facilities drain to sanitary sewer.
- Minimize de-icing salts or use alternate methods.
