Council Member Application Process

With the appointment of Damon Cann as Mayor, the North Logan City Council must appoint a new City Council person who will serve until the end of 2019. To qualify, an applicant must be a registered voter and must have lived in North Logan for at least 1 year. Interested applicants need to submit the following items to Karen Jewkes (Karen@northlogancity.org) by May 10th at 5pm:

- Name of Applicant (Required)
- A Statement of Interest (1 page) and supporting information (optional, 5 pages max).

Applicants will then be invited to the May 15th City Council meeting to participate in the interview process and the council will make a selection. The successful applicant will serve as council member through the end of 2019. An election will be held this November to fill the last two years of Councilman Cann's term; a primary will be held in August if more than two candidates file for the November election.

We will be considering the approval of the draft FY2020 budget at the first meeting in May, along with a consideration of a concept plan for a 23 lot subdivision located at 400 E 2150 N. At the second council meeting we will be interviewing candidates to fill the open vacancy on the Council. We will also, consider a proposal to implement tiered water rates in May.

Planning Commission: Thurs, May 2nd & 16th @ 6:30pm
We will finalize the recommended modifications to the Accessory Dwelling Unit ordinance. There will also be continued discussion regarding the Water Rights/Shares ordinance. The Phillips Subdivision Development Plan might be issued for consideration in May.

MUNICIPAL ELECTION

North Logan City 2019 Municipal Election (UCA 10-3-301) will be for three (3) Council Members, 4-year terms each (2020-2023) and (1) Mayor, 2-year term (2020-2021). Candidate Filing Period is from Monday, June 3, 2019 to Friday, June 7, 2019. Declaration of Candidacy Form or Nomination Petition will be available during the Candidate Filing Period and must be filed in person at the North Logan City Recorder's Office located at 2076 North 1200 East, between the hours of 8am and 5pm.

Candidates are subject to eligibility requirements identified in UCA 20A-9-203. Candidates are subject to financial disclosure requirements identified in UCA 10-3-208.

Primary Election to be held August 13, 2019 (if necessary).
General Election to be held November 5, 2019.
