

**MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

As I write this newsletter message we have just celebrated the birthday of our great nation with fireworks, parades, cookouts, family and fun. We are preparing for our city celebration on July 24<sup>th</sup>, themed Celebrating Our Heritage—Building Our Future. By the time you read this I hope you have enjoyed the fun of the summer with family and friends. I'm grateful we live in a place where we can enjoy such freedoms. There are still great summer activities to enjoy in our valley such as the county fair and rodeo, hikes, camping, etc.

Last month, Mayor Cann discussed several road construction projects including chip seal surface treatments and a new roundabout at 2200 North 400 East. While these projects can be frustrating and may cause inconveniences, we appreciate the patience of our citizens working around these needed maintenance and improvements. I hope at the time of this printing, these projects are nearing completion in a safe and efficient manner.

A new project the City Council will begin working on is to promote participation in the 2020 US Census. The national Census certainly isn't new, with the first Census beginning just over a year after the inauguration of President Washington. That Census included just six questions. A decennial Census is actually mandated by the United States Constitution. These numbers are important for a variety of reasons, including government representation and state tax allocation for roads, schools, and emergency services. Many businesses also use Census data.

The next Census Day is April 1, 2020. The Census Bureau will use technology to aid in the data collection. Households may still receive a mailer, but you may respond via online or by phone, as well as by mail. While participation in the Census may have some controversy, it is an important part of our society and government. I encourage you to watch for this event and participate in one of the genius tools of the founders that is a tool of political empowerment for the governed over their government.

One last note; as the month of August melts away, our schools will begin to be in session. Please be aware of school crossings and obey all of the traffic laws and procedures for the safety of our school children.

## CULINARY WATER NOTICE

We are implementing Phase 2 - **Yellow Level** - Moderate drought, from our Water Shortage Management Plan.

**TARGET:** Water Use Reduction: A city-wide reduction of water usage of 15-20%.

### REDUCTION STRATEGIES:

- Water users must cut back exterior watering (users shall water no more than 3 days per week).
- Commercial, Industrial & Research Buildings cut back on all in/outside usage.
- No washing of cars at residences.
- No spraying sidewalks, driveways.
- No excessive/wasteful watering (watering during a rainstorm).

Residents **east of the upper canal** must comply with the following measures:

- Reduce outdoor watering by at least 30%.
- Odd numbered houses may only water on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays.
- Even numbered houses may only water on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays.
- Stagger watering to different times of the day or evening.

We will also monitor water usage through real time water reports. If a North Logan water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement Standards. Full details at [www.northlogancity.org](http://www.northlogancity.org).

A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.
