

**MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

Pulitzer prize winning historian Jon Meacham in his thoughtful book, *The Soul of America* paraphrases President Theodore Roosevelt saying---The first duty of an American citizen begins with political engagement, doing that work in a practical manner and in accordance with the highest principles of honor and justice. While commendable, one need not become a candidate or political addict. However, paying attention, expressing informed opinions and acting upon them in the public arena are foundational obligations of citizenship. However, debate can easily degenerate into intolerance and contempt for opposing viewpoints. A higher standard of social interaction recognizes that only rarely does any one camp have a monopoly on virtue or wisdom.

Case in point: Early last year, citizens became embroiled in the legitimate question of whether or not to retain our own police department. At times, the discussion seemed in danger of degenerating into hostile, irreconcilable trench warfare. Ultimately, through the rule of mature public opinion, the willingness to consider the legitimacy of differing viewpoints, and the commitment of skilled law enforcement professionals during a period of transition, the dust has settled, and the police agency is functioning well.

I'm sure that on future issues large and small, citizens will continue to hold a wide range of views based on sincerely and deeply held beliefs. I hope we will do so civilly, constructively and as Abraham Lincoln said, "appealing to the better angels of our nature".

On a related note, as we embark on a new year, many thanks for your interest and support to me these past six months while recovering from a bone marrow cancer relapse. I'm particularly grateful to Damon Cann who performs so admirably as Mayor Pro Tem. Thanks also to Alan Luce, City Administrator and all the other City professionals whose sole purpose is to serve you so well. May 2019 be a banner year as we all work together and continue to make North Logan the "best place to call home". Happy New Year everyone!
