WINTER TREE TRIMMING

For all residents, we ask that you please trim your trees back to the edge of the roadway. This is being asked due to the winter months. When snow piles on the tree limbs it forces them to hang even lower, then they hit the headlights and mirrors of the snowplows causing them to break.

STORMWATER

Illicit Storm Water Discharge: "Any discharge into the stormwater system that is not composed entirely of storm water". NORTH LOGAN LIBRARY

Libraries have been around for a long time! The earliest libraries in ancient Samaria, about 3400-3100 BC, contained stone tablets with written records of crop yields and financial exchanges. The ancient Roman Empire had incredible libraries with scrolls and manuscripts that resemble the books we have today. In 79 AD Mt. Vesuvius buried the library at Pompeii, Italy, in volcanic ash. Now, almost 2000 years later, we are able to read some of the scrolls from Pompeii using CT scans. We are still learning new things from a 2000 year old library. Literacy was the backbone of the Roman Empire and still makes our civilization thrive today. Children come into the library every day and get excited about literacy. They are a part of an ancient tradition that makes the world a better and more civilized place.
