

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

After arduous deliberation and with regret, I submit my resignation as Mayor of North Logan effective April 2nd, 2019.

When campaigning for mayor, I was in good health intending to complete a full and productive term if elected. Unfortunately, a bone marrow cancer, previously in remission for fifteen years, relapsed. Months of therapy including a stem cell transplant last summer have been lifesaving and necessitated a temporary delegation of my mayoral duties. However, complete recovery and return to health is proving to be much slower and difficult than I expected, postponing repeatedly a timely return to the office of mayor.

In the face of ongoing treatment, I am cautiously optimistic about my long-term outcome. Nevertheless, I feel that I can presently best serve the citizens of North Logan by stepping aside and clearing the way without further delay for a qualified person who can bring to the mayor's office the requisite time and energy it deserves.

Thank you, City officials, employees, friends, neighbors and citizens for your ongoing concern and support. A special thanks to Damon Cann who has served so remarkably as Mayor Pro Tem and to Alan Luce, City Administrator.

It has been my privilege to serve as your mayor for this brief period. I am confident the City will be in good hands moving forward and I look forward to your further association as a fellow citizen.

Mayoral Application Process

With the announcement of Mayor John Bailey's resignation, the North Logan City Council must appoint a new mayor who will serve until the end of 2019. To qualify, an applicant must be a registered voter and must have lived in North Logan for at least 1 year. Interested applicants need to submit the following items to Karen Jewkes (Karen@northlogancity.org) by April 16th at 5pm:

- Name of Applicant (Required)
- A Statement of Interest (1 page) and supporting information (optional, 5 pages max).

Applicants will then be invited to the April 17th City Council meeting to participate in the interview process and the council will make a selection. The successful applicant will serve as mayor through the end of 2019. An election will be held this November to fill the last two years of Mayor Bailey's term; a primary will be held in August if more than two candidates file for the November election.

North Logan City 2019 Municipal Election (UCA 10-3-301) will be for three (3) Council Members, 4-year terms each (2020-2023) and (1) Mayor, 2-year term (2020-2021)

Candidate Filing Period is from Monday, June 3, 2019 to Friday, June 7, 2019. Declaration of Candidacy Form or Nomination Petition will be available during the Candidate Filing Period and must be filed in person at the North Logan City Recorder's Office located at 2076 North 1200 East, between the hours of 8am and 5pm.

Candidates are subject to eligibility requirements identified in UCA 20A-9-203. Candidates are subject to financial disclosure requirements identified in UCA 10-3-208.

Primary Election to be held August 13, 2019 (if necessary).
 General Election to be held November 5, 2019.

NORTH PARK POLICE

There is one thing that continues to confuse drivers: The roundabouts. Roundabouts are becoming more familiar in the U.S. because they are safer than traffic intersections and have been proven to reduce vehicle and pedestrian collisions while improving traffic flow and reduce delays. As safe as they are, roundabouts can be tricky to navigate and confusing as where to look, where to enter and where to exit. Here are some guidelines to help.

- ♦ Watch for the yellow "roundabout ahead" sign, then reduce speed on approach
- ♦ Be on the lookout for pedestrians and bicyclists
- ♦ Look left, and if you see traffic in the roundabout, yield
- ♦ When you see a break in traffic, you can safely enter
- ♦ Drive around the roundabout until you get to your exit
- ♦ Use your turn signal, watch for other cars and exit safely
