

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

School is back in and Fall is underway in North Logan. This brings a number of changes to our community. One important change that you'll have noticed is the stop sign at 2500 N and 800 E. The City Council ordered a traffic study of this intersection and the results found that it was failing on several metrics. It is one of our more problematic intersections in terms of traffic accidents, and it also is a key corridor for kids walking, biking, and (for high school students) driving to school. The study recommended taking immediate action in terms of making it a 4-way stop to improve safety. A 4-way stop is not the right long-term solution in this location, so please know this is just a step to improve safety until we can identify funding for a long-term solution like a traffic light or a roundabout.

Another change taking place in the city is the retirement of our long-time Utilities Superintendent, Bob Wilhelm. Bob has served the city in a wide variety of ways over the years. He retires with a wealth of knowledge about the locations of various valves, pipes, junctions, and other key infrastructure in the city (we've been working for some time to "download" his knowledge for other employees and various computerized tracking systems). For many years Bob has worked tirelessly fixing water leaks in the middle of the night, making sure that the sewers are flowing, and just helping to make sure our citizens have the high level of utility service we've all come to expect. A big thanks is due to Bob for helping to make sure things are working right in our city and we wish him the best in retirement!

NORTH PARK POLICE**BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY**

We would like to ask everyone to remember that schools are back in session. Kids will be traversing neighborhoods and crosswalks as they make their way to and from school. While in a school zone, Utah Law states that a vehicle is not allowed to proceed through or turn while pedestrians are occupying any portion of the crosswalk.

School busses with their lights flashing yellow is a warning to motorists that they are preparing to stop. When the bus lights flash red you may not overtake or pass the bus. You are required to come to a stop and are unable to proceed until the flashing red lights are turned off. Even after the lights have been turned off, watch for children in the area as you proceed.

CULINARY WATER NOTICE

Water Restriction level is at Green

STORMWATER

On-site retention/detention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property, reducing the risk of flooding. Vegetation intercepts rainfall, reducing the erosivity. Root systems increase pore space and promote infiltration of storm water and the roots help to anchor soil. Vegetation can also help to remove pollutants from storm water through biological uptake of nutrients.
