

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

North Logan City has a long and proud tradition of excellent fire service. Almost 3 decades ago, we established our own fire department, with our first volunteers sanding down and repainting the used engines the city acquired. About 5 years ago, we added ambulance service originating from our North Logan Fire Station (rather than coming the extra distance from neighboring cities), a measure that has been a literal life saver. A corps of talented volunteers, along with a few full-time staff, has done a remarkable job of serving the city.

In the last few years, our fire and ambulance call volume has grown significantly, outpacing what can be managed with a primarily volunteer staff. Additionally, there are county-wide changes in provision of emergency services because of the impending dissolution of the CCEMS network. Our city's elected officials have carefully evaluated a variety of options over the last several months, and in our most recent meeting, the city council and I endorsed a plan where we collaborate with Logan City to provide an elevated level of service to our residents. North Logan will continue to own and maintain our station and equipment, but beginning July 1, full-time firefighters, EMTs, and paramedics from Logan will be on staff in our station 24/7. Additionally, if a second fire or medical call comes in while the staff in our station is out on a call, the other 3 stations in Logan city will respond to calls in North Logan. This approach provides a level of backup in the system that will make the level of services in both cities stronger.

While this approach will cost the city more due to increased staffing costs, economies of scale and cost-sharing mean that the cost of this arrangement with Logan will be less than what the cost to North Logan City would be if we tried to cover the staffing costs of our station alone. Additionally, we have the benefit of automatic service from Logan's other stations. Because we will maintain our station and our equipment, should the time come that another arrangement is more advantageous, we can resume our own department without incurring the major capital costs of startup.

We are excited about the opportunities this provides for an improved level of service. Some who are familiar with the insurance industry have predicted that the higher level of service will lead to lower homeowners' insurance costs for our residents and businesses. We look forward to being able to deliver a higher level of service to you all and making sure that this important, core municipal function is provided with efficiency and excellence.
