

**MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

By the time you have read this message, North Logan City will have completed its modified schedule of July 24<sup>th</sup> activities. Like so many other activities this year, this celebration required careful planning, and many dedicated hours from our incredible city staff to safely hold these community-centric, modified events. The City Council will hold a public hearing on August 5th to receive input on a proposed property tax increase of \$14 per year per household. This property tax increase will be used to cover Fire and Police costs. There will be the consideration of a high density residential development west of Holiday Inn Express. In addition, the City will discuss the vacation of right of way along the east end of Aspen Meadows Subdivision.

The Planning Commission will continue discussing the proposed water rights ordinance, Main St. Master Planning, Industrial Zone landscaping requirements, and regulations for beehives and apiaries in residential zones.

### **The North Logan City Library is Open**

## STORMWATER

We are asking the residents of North Logan to please **not** place piles of topsoil, mulch, woodchips, gravel, dirt, tree limbs, or landscaping materials of any kind in the **curb** or **roadway**. A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.
