

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

As I write this, we're continuing to see significant case counts of COVID-19. I strongly encourage everyone to take personal responsibility for their actions and to follow the guidance of the Bear River Health Department, including:

- Keep a physical distance of 6 feet or more from others.
- Always wear a face mask when visiting stores, and places where there are a number of individuals around you.
- Wash hands frequently.
- Protect those who are 65 and older, the immunocompromised, and those that have underlying health conditions.

While we ask each of you to do your part, we are also working to provide support to the community to help with the impacts of COVID-19. The city has received funds from the CARES Act for this very purpose and we are working on developing two programs. The first is a program that would provide utility assistance to individuals whose employment has been affected by the pandemic. If you are in a position where you have lost employment, been furloughed, had your work hours reduced, or had your wages reduced due to COVID-19, visit the COVID-19 page at www.northlogancity.org to get more information about possible support for utility assistance. The second is a program that would provide small grants (up to \$1,000) for businesses that have been affected by COVID-19. We will send details about this program out via email through our North Logan Business Alliance network; those who receive those emails will hear about it. If you don't receive those emails, details will also be posted on the COVID-19 page on the city's web page. We are working to make both of these programs available in July.
