

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

By the time this reaches your mailbox, we'll have been under significant social distancing guidelines for a month and a half. I am appreciative of the ways our community has come together to "flatten the curve" of the Coronavirus. I am saddened by the effects of the disease and the toll it has taken on our state and our nation in terms of physical health, mental health, social isolation, and the economy. We are working closely with the terrific experts at the Bear River Health Department and receive periodic feedback from the state Coronavirus Taskforce (composed of medical, social, and economic experts). Please know that the transition back to regular life will be less of a "flipped switch" and more of a gradually turned dial; we ask for your support as we navigate what we hope will be the tail end of our experience with COVID-19.

While we work through the health issues of these times, city business continues to move forward. While the city office is currently closed to the public, we continue to do business online and over the telephone. Our work crews continue in a socially distanced manner while taking care of our roads and parks. Our library is offering an amazing drive-up service. Building inspections and subdivision development continue to move forward, as do utility bill payment, business licensing, and cemetery services. Unfortunately, one service that is being reduced is the Green Waste service. This past month the Cache County Solid Waste Advisory Board and Logan City Environmental sent North Logan City a letter informing us that the all of the Green Waste bins in Cache Valley, including the Elk Ridge Park Green Waste Bins, would only be available during the months of April and October. North Logan does not have a seat on this board (though this is something we are trying to get addressed), so I have been lobbying several members of the board to reconsider this decision. In the mean time, the city council is determining whether there is a way we can continue some level of green waste service. It is difficult because if we pay to put out bins, we bear additional costs that were previously covered as part of our solid waste service. Additionally, if we put out bins but no other cities do, everyone north of us would stop to dump in the North Logan funded bins instead of driving past our bins on the way to the dump. The city council is debating whether there is a cost-effective way to continue to provide some green waste service in our city. Stay tuned, but in the mean time, you can take green waste to the Logan city site on 200 N for no charge, or can order an individual green waste can to your home, though Logan charges \$5/month (billed with your North Logan water/sewer/garbage bill) to add this service. North Logan does not see any revenue through that program. Please do not dump green waste in the field near the green waste area; we are beginning to develop that ground into a bike course.

CENSUS

The larger the census count in North Logan City, the more funding we receive for schools, roads, and public safety for the **next 10 years!!** While the census is based on where you live on April 1st, you will still be able to fill out the census for the next couple of months. If you don't have the 12 digit code, you can still fill out the form by using your physical address.

NORTH PARK POLICE

Please remember the 3100 N road project between Highway 91 and 1200 E (1200 E to 1600 E will take place later this year) will cause some short-term inconveniences but we will all benefit from it when completed. Please Do Not disregard the road closed signs during the construction. There will be times the roadway will have big holes, construction workers, large pieces of equipment and other hazards which can cause property damage or personal injury, if ignored. We will be issuing citations for these violations, so please find other routes during the closures.

We are still asking citizens to call or email us with any questions or records requests rather than coming into the police department, if at all possible.

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

City Council Meetings will take place on Wednesday, May 6th and 20th at the Library, however the meetings will only be available to the public online (please go to the City website or Facebook page for more info and for links to follow the live meetings). The City Council will consider approval of a tentative FY2021 municipal budget in the May 6th Mtg. There will also be a public hearing on May 20th regarding a potential property tax increase. The City Council will continue discussions regarding a draft ordinance regarding water rights.

Planning Commission Meeting (on-line) will take place on Thursday, May 7th and 21st. The Planning Commission will continue their discussion of zoning as it relates to the area west of Main St., from 2200N to 2550N, along with potential revisions to the North Logan City Code regarding Site Development Requirements along Main St..

NORTH LOGAN LIBRARY

The Library & COVID-19. The North Logan City Library is working hard to keep you safe, informed, and supplied with library materials during the COVID-19 crisis. The library is offering a limited curbside hold pickup service, Monday – Friday, 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. To take advantage of this service, go to the library's website at northloganlibrary.org. All library staff are strictly following Bear River Health Department and CDC guidelines as they handle books and interact with the public. To keep you safe, all items returned to the library are placed in a 24-hour quarantine before going back into circulation.

Online Materials. The library is offering more online materials than ever before as people work and do schooling from home. More E-books and E-audio books are available every day. Library staff are working to keep the website (northloganlibrary.org) up to date with fun activities to do at home. The library also contributes to, and participates with, the statewide effort to produce online story times.

WATER ORDINANCE

North Logan City has updated ordinances to protect our water system from cross connections. A cross connection is any actual or potential connection between a potable water system and any other source of system through which it is possible to introduce into the public drinking water. To ensure cross connections are being avoided or protected against, the city will begin inspecting all commercial and industrial businesses annually to identify any existing connections and provide recommendations for the best protective means.
