EMERGENCY INFO - "COMMUNITY CONNECT"

Have you ever wondered if the fire department knows essential information that may help save your family, pets, or property? Community Connect can make that possible. Community Connect is a secure, easy to use platform that allows residents to self-report critical information about their household to aid first responders and emergency service personnel to respond more efficiently and effectively; ultimately resulting in better incident outcomes.

Community Connect is completely voluntary and residents decide which information they are comfortable sharing with first responders. Residents simply create a profile and enter critical information for public safety agencies at the time of dispatch. Data provided by residents within Community Connect is 100% secure and is used only for the purpose of better serving the residents during emergency situations.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT - CARES Act Grants

North Logan City has received federal funding from the CARES Act that we would like to distribute to the residents and businesses of the community. Grants are available to qualifying businesses for up to 10% of lost revenue (capped at \$10,000 per business), and residents who qualify can receive grants to cover utility costs. City Council Meetings will take place on Wed., Oct. 7th & 21st. During the month of October, the City Council will be considering a plat amendment to the Brookhaven Subdivision, and a Development Plan for the proposed Contrada Subdivision. In addition, there will be discussions regarding updates to landscape requirements for developments in the industrial zones.

Planning Commission Meeting will take place on Thurs., Oct. 8th and 22nd. The Planning Commission will consider for recommendation the updated Water Rights Ordinance and the Apiary Ordinance, along with a new ordinance regarding short term rentals (Air B&B's) in North Logan City.

We are pleased to announce that the sale of plots for phase 2 of the North Logan Cemetery will take place on Thursday, November 5th, at 10am at the North Logan City Offices. North Park Police Department joined with the Bear River Health Department for a Drug Take-Back Program. This one day event was very successful. I would like to remind our citizens that there is a drug take-back box located at the North Park Police Department, and Hyde Park City Offices. You are encouraged to utilize these drop boxes during regular business hours. We do ask that you only use these drop boxes for disposal of acceptable medications. There are also other locations throughout the valley where you can take your unused prescription medication for proper disposal.

The Water Department continually works to protect our drinking water supply. Since the implementation of North Logan's Cross-Connection Control Program in April, we have inspected 189 businesses. Of those 189 businesses, 55 were required to improve water protections. 257 passing backflow assembly tests have been conducted throughout the city so far. STORMWATER

Water Pollution and Leaves:

Fall is in the air and that means it's time to clean up those leaves in your yard. As you do, please remember to NOT put grass clippings, leaves, and yard debris in the street, storm drain, or ditch.

Littering with your yard debris can cause problems for your water. Drains can clog, streets can flood, and water can become polluted. To avoid this, use clippings and leaves as fertilizer or use a mulching lawn mower. Maybe try composting, or call 435-716-9755 to sign up for a green waste container for \$5.00 per month (weekly pick up April - Nov). Please be considerate while cleaning up your yards this fall season. Thank you!

WATER METER LIDS

Please make sure that North Logan City water meter lids on your property remain clear of obstructions or landscaping to allow for emergency access as well as maintenance of the water meters. Also, we are installing new water meters that have antennas mounted in the lids, and they have been getting broken by mowing and other causes.
