EMERGENCY INFO - "COMMUNITY CONNECT"

Have you ever wondered if the fire department knows essential information that may help save your family, pets, or property? Community Connect can make that possible. Community Connect is a secure, easy to use platform that allows residents to self-report critical information about their household to aid first responders and emergency service personnel to respond more efficiently and effectively; ultimately resulting in better incident outcomes.

Community Connect is completely voluntary and residents decide which information they are comfortable sharing with first responders. Residents simply create a profile and enter critical information for public safety agencies at the time of dispatch. Data provided by residents within Community Connect is 100% secure and is used only for the purpose of better serving the residents during emergency situations.

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

City Council Meetings will take place on Wed., Sept. 2nd & 16th. On September 2nd the City Council will consider a concept plan for property at approximately 1200E 2500N. There will also be discussion about the City's personnel policy updates and a potential Active Transportation Plan. The September 16th meeting will be a joint City Council and Planning Commission land use planning workshop.

Planning Commission Meeting will take place on Thurs, Sept. 3rd. On September 3rd, the Planning Commission will go over the City's landscaping requirements for the Industrial Zone. In September there will also be a discussion of the proposed water rights and water conservation ordinance updates.

STORMWATER

On-site retention/detention of storm water is intended to increase the infiltration, retention of storm water, resulting in an overall reduction in the volume of water leaving a property, reducing the risk of flooding. Vegetation intercepts rainfall, reducing the erosivity. Root systems increase pore space and promote infiltration of storm water and the roots help to anchor soil. Vegetation can also help to remove pollutants from storm water through biological uptake of nutrients.
