**ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT - CARES Act Grants**

North Logan City has received federal funding from the CARES Act that we would like to distribute to the residents and businesses of the community. Grants are available to qualifying businesses for up to 10% of lost revenue (capped at \$10,000 per business), and residents who qualify can receive grants to cover utility costs. **EMERGENCY INFO - "COMMUNITY CONNECT"**

Have you ever wondered if the Fire Department knows essential information that may help save your family, pets, or property? Community Connect can make that possible. Community Connect is a secure, easy-to-use platform that allows residents to self-report critical information about their household to aid first responders and emergency service personnel to respond more efficiently and effectively; ultimately resulting in better incident outcomes.

Community Connect is completely voluntary and residents decide which information they are comfortable sharing with first responders. Residents simply create a profile and enter critical information for public safety agencies at the time of dispatch. Data provided by residents within Community Connect is 100% secure and is used only for the purpose of better serving the residents during emergency situations.

**City Council Meetings will take place on Wed., Nov. 4th & 18th.** The City Council will hold a public hearing regarding a proposal to vacate a public utility easement at 1810N 1200E. The City Council will also be discussing updating the section of code dealing with Administrative Fines and penalties for nuisance items.

**Planning Commission Meetings will take place on Thurs., Nov. 5th & 19th.** The Planning Commission will be finalizing the proposed code recommendations for short term rental properties. The Planning Commission will also be considering a proposed development plan for properties near 2600 N Wolf Pack Way.

**GREEN WASTE**

In order to meet the increased demand for green waste dumpsters, the Cache County Solid Waste Advisory Board, along with Logan City Environmental, will be implementing a \$1/month fee on each residential garbage account, which will start in January of 2021. This fee will enable Logan Environmental to place green waste bins in Elk Ridge West throughout the summer months as they have done in the past. Logan Environmental has also committed to adding one more bin at Elk Ridge West due to the large amount of usage from North Logan and the surrounding communities. ### Cemetery Flower & Decoration Removal:

On November 26th the city will discard all decorations and flowers from the Cemetery that appear out of condition or are not in compliance with the city's Cemetery Ordinance, including shepherds hooks. This cleaning takes place semi-annually after the Memorial Day and Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance, please go to the city website, [www.northlogancity.org](http://www.northlogancity.org).

"Glass containers are prohibited...small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, flowers, decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain within the 6" concrete base (mowing strip) on the north and/or south of the headstone/monument. Shepherds hooks, pinwheels, etc. are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone, mowing strip. All decorations, vases, toys, etc., are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed."

## WATER DEPARTMENT

North Logan's Cross Connection Control Program ensures that our public drinking water supply is safe and protected. In order to do so, we require businesses to have their backflows tested annually. Starting in 2021, all new homes built will be required to adhere to this same standard. We highly encourage homes with a backflow assembly to have theirs tested as well. ## STORMWATER

- Inspect & clean inlets and catch basins of any debris
- Install oil/water separators, chemical separators, snouts, or other appropriate filtration devices
- Verify that wash bay facilities are draining to sanitary sewer and not to storm drains
- Minimize the use of de-icing salts or use alternate methods for snow removal
- Cover loaded trucks to prevent items from blowing out and entering storm drain systems
- Cover trash containers to prevent garbage migration via wind and/or animals to storm water system

## WINTER PARKING REGULATIONS

Winter parking restrictions will be going into effect. Please be sure to have your **vehicles off the streets** so the plow drivers can keep the roads clear of snow this winter. North Park Police officers will be issuing citations if you are in violation of the following code:

### 11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking Prohibited

No person shall park a vehicle on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) a.m. and five o'clock (5:00) a.m. of any day, **beginning November 15 and ending the last day of February of each year**, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.
