We have some major items on the agenda before us, and I'm resolved to focus on the basics of municipal services in the new year. We are developing a new water master plan and working to improve the city's water security, with planning for an additional reservoir and updates so we can have steady and predictable supplies of clean water into the future. We are working on addressing how fire and EMS/ambulance services will be provided--with the dissolution of Cache County EMS service slated for a year from now, we must either provide EMS service ourselves or contract with Logan City to provide those services. We are resolved as a city to continue to see to it that our citizens have similar or even improved level of EMS services as we prepare to move forward.

Finally, as a new year's resolution, I've thought about how I can be more available to citizens to visit. In my day job as a professor, I hold office hours so I can talk with my students and help them with issues and challenges. In January, I'd like to experiment with holding "Mayor's Office Hours". I'll be in the North Logan Library on Thursday January 16th from 9am-10:30am and again January 30 from 9am-10:30am. Whether there is an issue you'd like to talk through or if you'd just like to say hi, I'd be delighted to have you stop by.

There will also be a public hearing in January regarding a Community Development Block Grant for a proposed water line replacement.

**Planning Commission Meeting will take place on Thursday, January 9th and 23rd.** The Planning Commission will be discussing updates to the Street Lighting Section of the Design Standards Technical Manual, along with consideration of a draft Water Rights Ordinance.
