

**MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

It's exciting that our Decennial 2020 Census is just around the corner. The Census is a snapshot of our community on the Census Day, April 1, 2020. The Census is important to our community because it affects things like federal and state representation, education and road funding, even emergency service rates.

Within the next month you should begin to see public service announcements and advertisements to participate in the 2020 Census. Beginning around March 12, 2020, first notices will be sent to homes encouraging self-reporting via online or phone. You may get one or two reminder postcards before a paper census form is sent. May through July, census employees will go house to house contacting those who haven't responded.

Questions arise about who and how to report on the census such as "My high school sophomore lives at home where he's playing video games at this very moment?" "My daughter is living in a dorm room and tolerating a messy roommate?" "My brother-in-law stays in the basement and just won't leave?" "My baby was born on March 30, 2020?" "Do I count my daughter or son serving a church mission?" These are all valid and important questions as we encourage a full and accurate count. These questions can be answered online at [2020census.gov](http://2020census.gov) or by asking a member of the North Logan Census Committee. If you would like to join our 2020 Census Committee please call the city office or join the next meeting on February 12, at 7:00 p.m. at the library.

The 2020 Census is currently recruiting for census workers for May through August. If you are interested or know of others that may be interested, applications are available at [2020census.gov/jobs](http://2020census.gov/jobs).

Please be aware of any possible fraud. The Census will never ask you for your social security number, for money or donations, anything on behalf of a political party, or your bank and credit card numbers. Individual census information is protected and not allowed to be used by other agencies for 70 years.

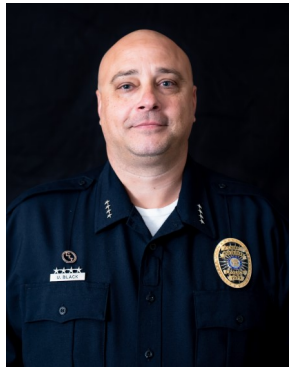
