

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

I'm sometimes asked how some items end up on the North Logan City Council agenda. Often, people asking about it are concerned that any item placed on the agenda must be something that the City Council wants to see passed. The reality is that City Council is the time for the council to discuss, deliberate and decide; and decisions aren't made on items until it comes before the council in a public meeting. In fact, it is against the law for more than two City Council members to meet and discuss council business outside of a public meeting, something that our council follows very carefully.

The items that come onto the City Council agenda come from a variety of sources. Sometimes, they come from issues the state requires us to consider. Sometimes they are items proposed by city staff or a member of the City Council. Other times, they are proposed by residents, land owners, or other people with an interest in what is happening in North Logan; and as long as they meet basic requirements, we place those items on the agenda for discussion. Sometimes, the City Council supports a proposed action, other times they don't. But I have observed that our city officials always give careful and thorough consideration to every item that comes before the council.

There will also be a consideration of a declaration of city surplus property along Wolf Pack Way, near 2600N.

The Planning Commission will have a public hearing on March 4, 2021 at 6:35 p.m. to consider a rezone of 9 acres of property located at 2000N 600E (Proposed Rezone from RE-1 to R-1-15). Country Stars, Philosophers, Billionaires, and Rock Stars all Love the Library

Dolly Parton has raised millions of dollars, and secured millions of book donations, for young readers across the United States and the world. She is proud to be known as, "The Book Lady." She said, "If I'm remembered 100 years from now, I hope it will be not for looks but for books." She made it her life's mission to help kids learn to read, "If you can read, you can find books on anything you want. You can self-educate even if you can't afford to go to school."

Books and libraries played a prominent role in civilized society throughout history. The ancient Roman philosopher and orator, Cicero, famously recognized two things that bring joy in life. "If you have a garden and a library, you have everything you need."

Nineteenth century billionaire, Andrew Carnegie, paid for the construction of hundreds of libraries across the United States, including Utah.
