EMERGENCY INFO - "COMMUNITY CONNECT"

Have you ever wondered if the fire department knows essential information that may help save your family, pets, or property? Community Connect can make that possible. Community Connect is a secure, easy to use platform that allows residents to self-report critical information about their household to aid first responders and emergency service personnel to respond more efficiently and effectively; ultimately resulting in better incident outcomes.

Community Connect is completely voluntary, and residents decide which information they are comfortable sharing with first responders. Residents simply create a profile and enter critical information for public safety agencies at the time of dispatch. Data provided by residents within Community Connect is 100% secure and is used only for the purpose of better serving the residents during emergency situations.

SNOW REMOVAL

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council Meetings will take place on Wed., January 6th and 20th. In January, the City Council will be considering modifying the city code related to short term rentals and an update to some of the city's franchise agreements. There will also be updates from the city's Streets, Engineering, Parks, and Trails Departments on multiple projects and plans that are in the works. The Redevelopment Agency will be considering updates to the proposed new Community Reinvestment Area as well.

The Planning Commission Meetings will take place Thurs., January 7th and 21st. The Planning Commission will be going over the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan that has been drafted in collaboration with the Bear River Association of Governments. There will be consideration of development plans for two properties along Wolf Pack Way.

GREEN WASTE

In order to cover the costs of the green waste bins at Elk Ridge West, The Cache Solid Waste Advisory Board, along with Logan Environmental have opted to assess a \$1/month fee on all residential utility accounts starting in January of 2021. This fee increase will be included in your monthly garbage bill. Logan Environmental has also committed to providing a third bin at Elk Ridge West this coming summer. NORTH PARK POLICE

Winter parking restrictions are in effect. Please be sure to have your **vehicles off the streets** so the plow drivers can keep the roads clear of snow this winter. North Park Police officers will be issuing citations if you are in violation of the following code:

11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking

Prohibited No person shall park a vehicle on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) a.m. and five o'clock (5:00) a.m. of any day, **beginning November 15 and ending the last day of February of each year**, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.
