GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council Meetings will take place on Wednesdays, November 3rd and 17th, at 6:30 p.m. The City Council will be discussing updates to the Employee Handbook of the City. They will also be looking at approving the Economic Development Masterplan, and will have a discussion regarding a Good Landlord Licensing program. In addition, there will be a consideration of updates to the code related to storage units. The concept plan for the Smiling H Development consisting of 128 lots (650 E 2500 N) will be considered. They will also potentially be considering a rezone for a parcel at 2350 E 2700 N from RE-5 to RE-1.

The Planning Commission Meetings will take place on Thursdays, November 4th and 18th, at 6:30 p.m. The Planning Commission will be discussing thresholds for slopes of new roads, water conservation developmental policies, water service line/ meter requirements for new developments, ingress/egress requirements for developments, and a potential lot legitimization ordinance.

NORTH PARK POLICE

Like it or not, winter is coming! A few reminders...

Parking Restrictions are as follows:

11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking Prohibited

No person shall park a vehicle on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) a.m. and five o'clock (5:00) a.m. of any day, beginning November 15 and ending the last day of February of each year, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.

Officers will be issuing citations to those violating the overnight parking ordinance

When clearing the snow from your driveways, remember **it is against the law** to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers. Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, and children trying to pass on their way to school. Thank you for your cooperation!

Allow yourself plenty of stopping distance and time to react to hazards that may present themselves due to road conditions or inattentive drivers!

Allow yourself extra time to get to your destination so you do not feel rushed!

Scrape your windows and allow time for them to defrost before hitting the roadways! (Cleaning a small area of the driver side windshield does not count!)

The goal is to get to and from home safely; but if you find yourself in an accident, call 911 or our non-emergency dispatch number at 435-753-7555 and an officer will respond.

Cemetery Flower & Decoration Removal:

On November 26th, the city will discard all decorations and flowers from the Cemetery that appear out of condition or are not in compliance with the City's Cemetery Ordinance, including shepherds hooks. This cleaning takes place semi-annually after the Memorial Day and Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance please go to the city website, www.northlogancity.org.

*"Glass containers are prohibited...small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, flowers, decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain **within the 6" concrete base** (mowing strip) on the **north and/or south** of the headstone/monument. Shepherds hooks, pinwheels, etc. are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone, mowing strip. All decorations, vases, toys, etc., are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed."*

STREETS

With fall upon us, we will be sending our street sweeper around to clean the roads and gutters of debris. Some areas will have to be hit a number of times, so please be patient with us.

We will also have our crews out crack-sealing certain areas in town, weather permitting. Most of our focus on crack-seal will remain east of 1200 E.

WATER

Now that winter is here, it's time to blow out your sprinkler system to avoid freezing pipes. If you have a backflow assembly, remember to remove it for winter, or cover it to avoid parts breaking from freezing. If you're planning to be out of town for a longer period of time over the winter, remember to keep your heater on to avoid pipes bursting from freezing.

SEWER

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter WATER usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your Winter Average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.
